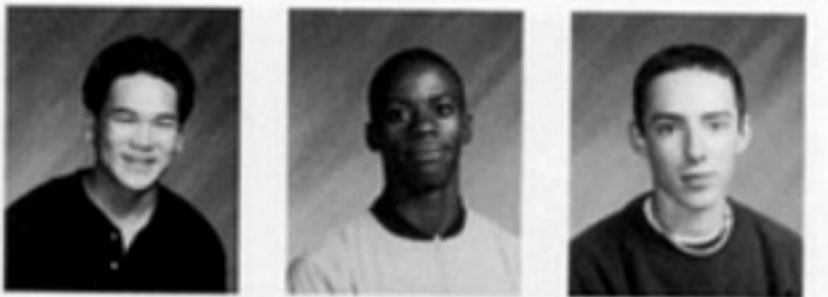

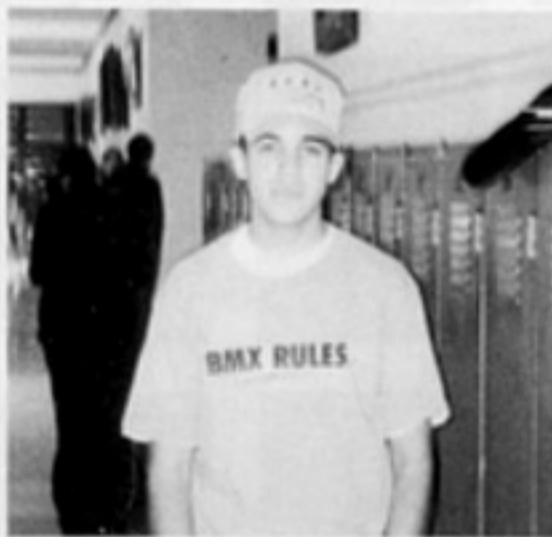

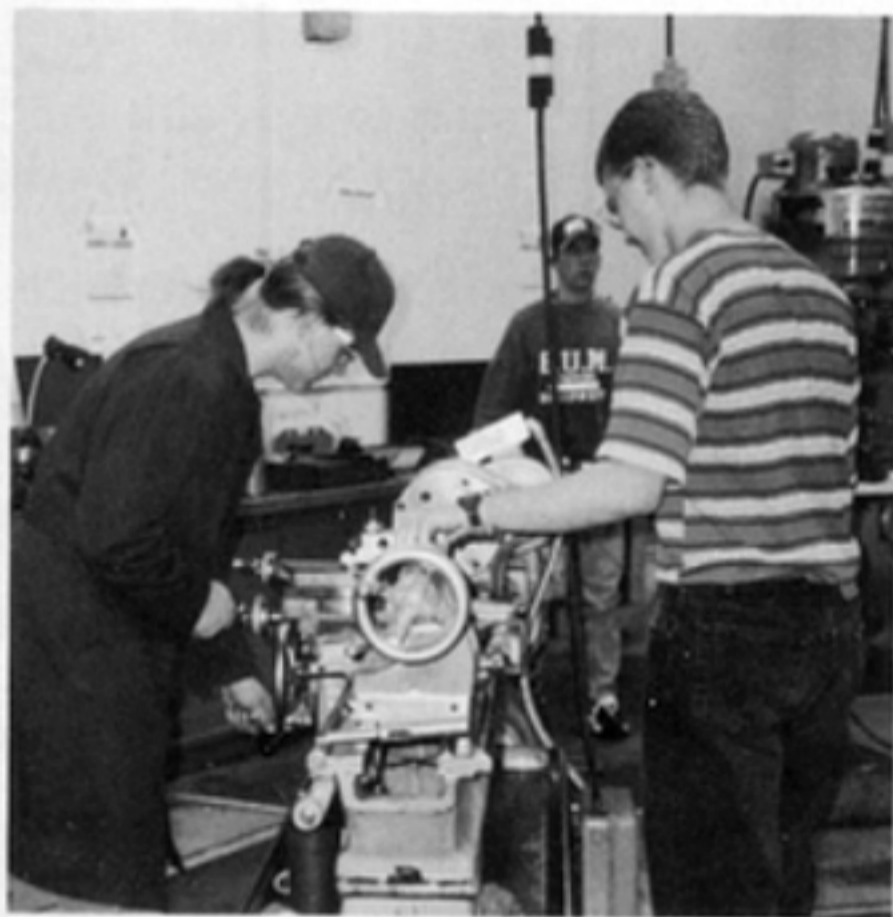

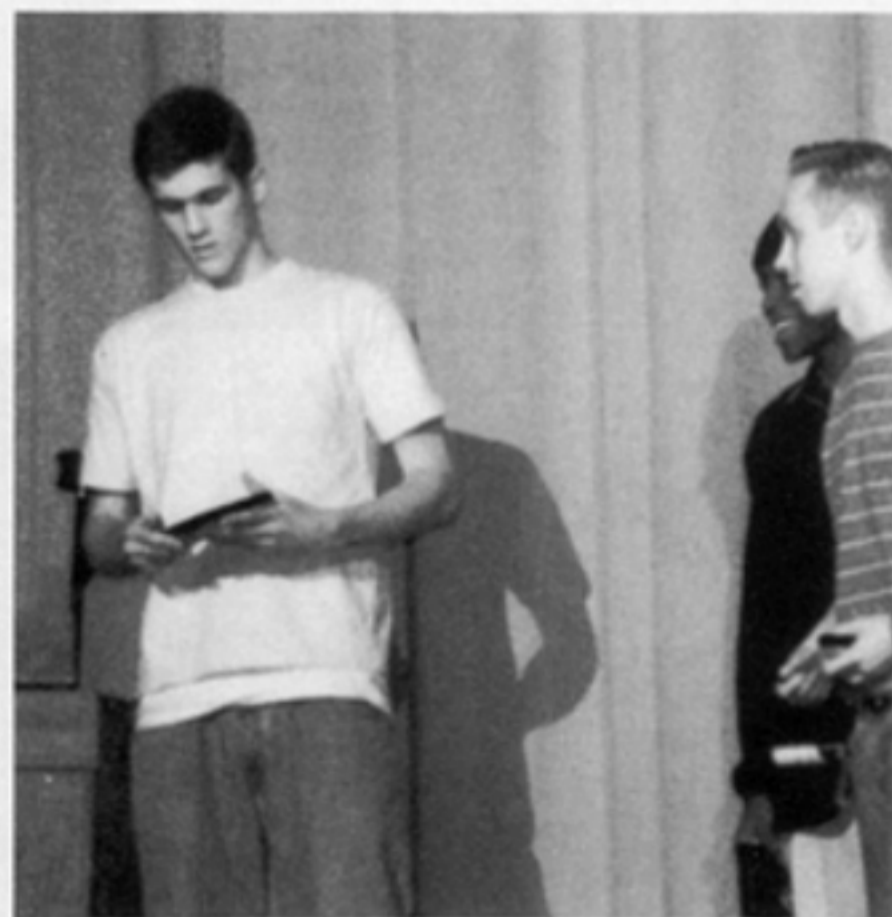

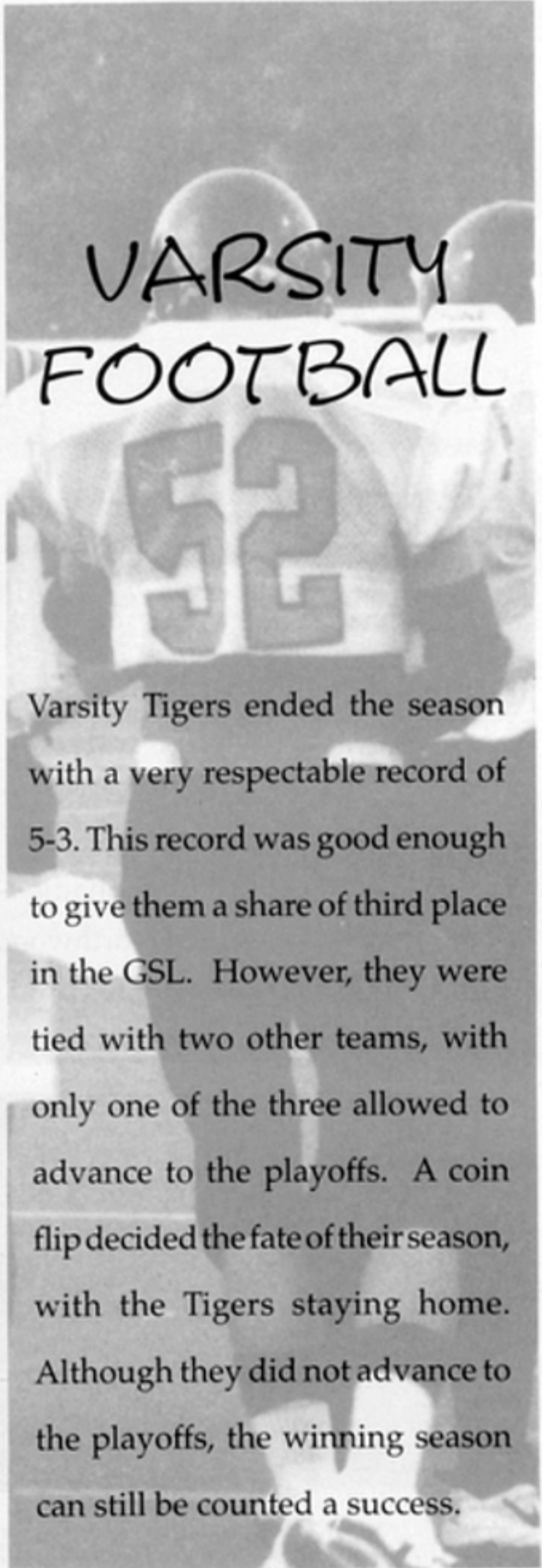

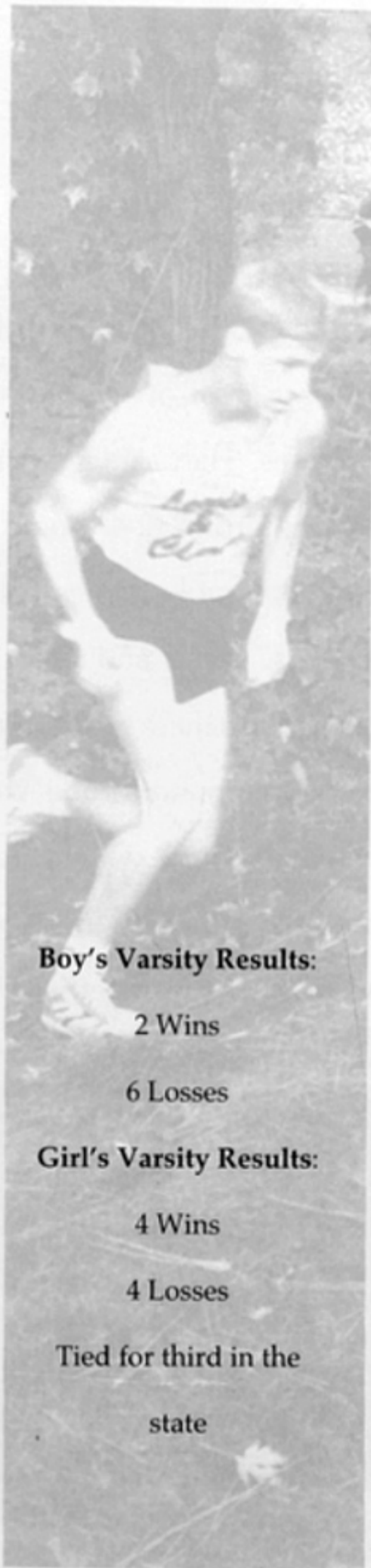

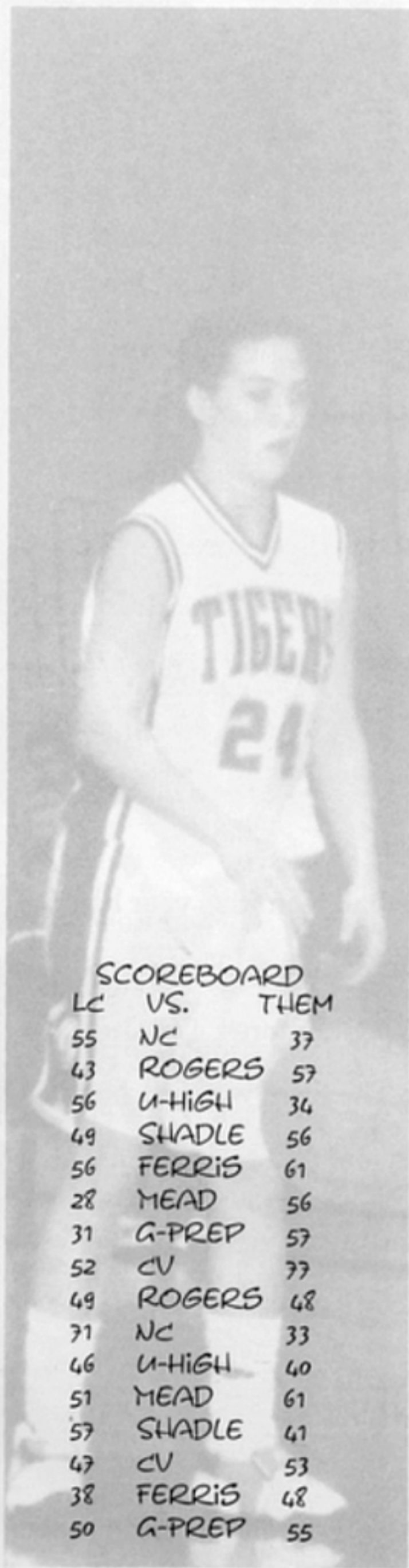

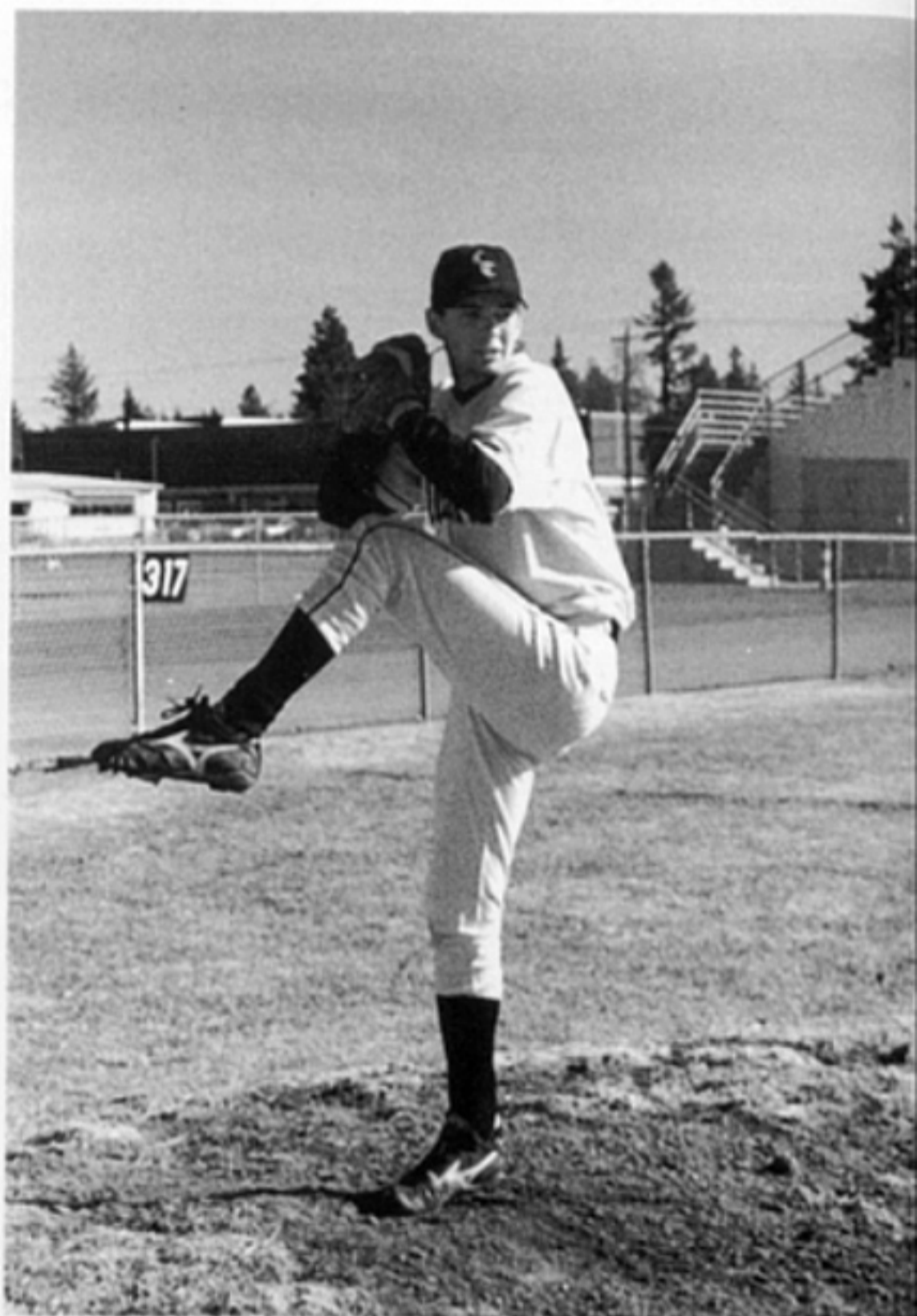

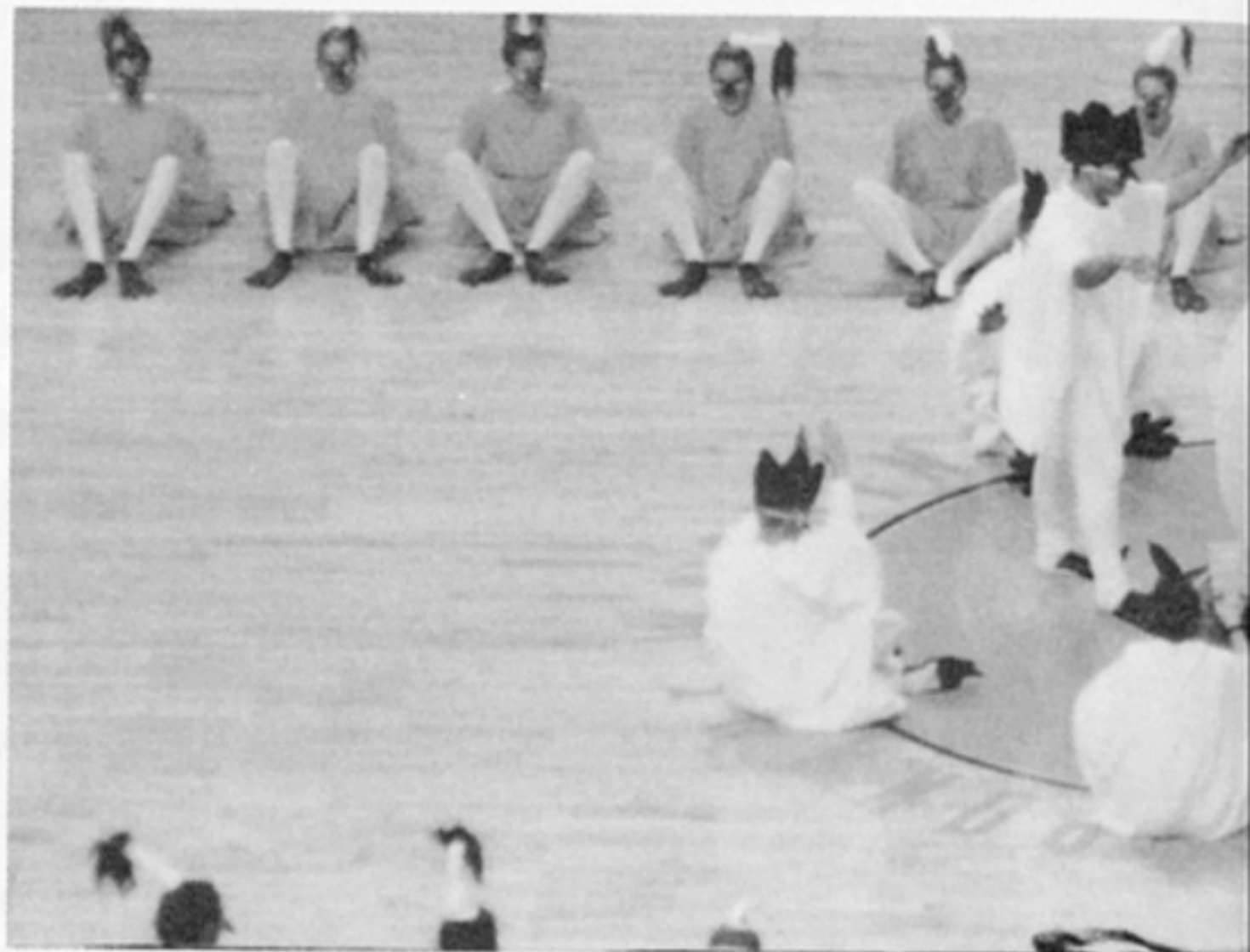

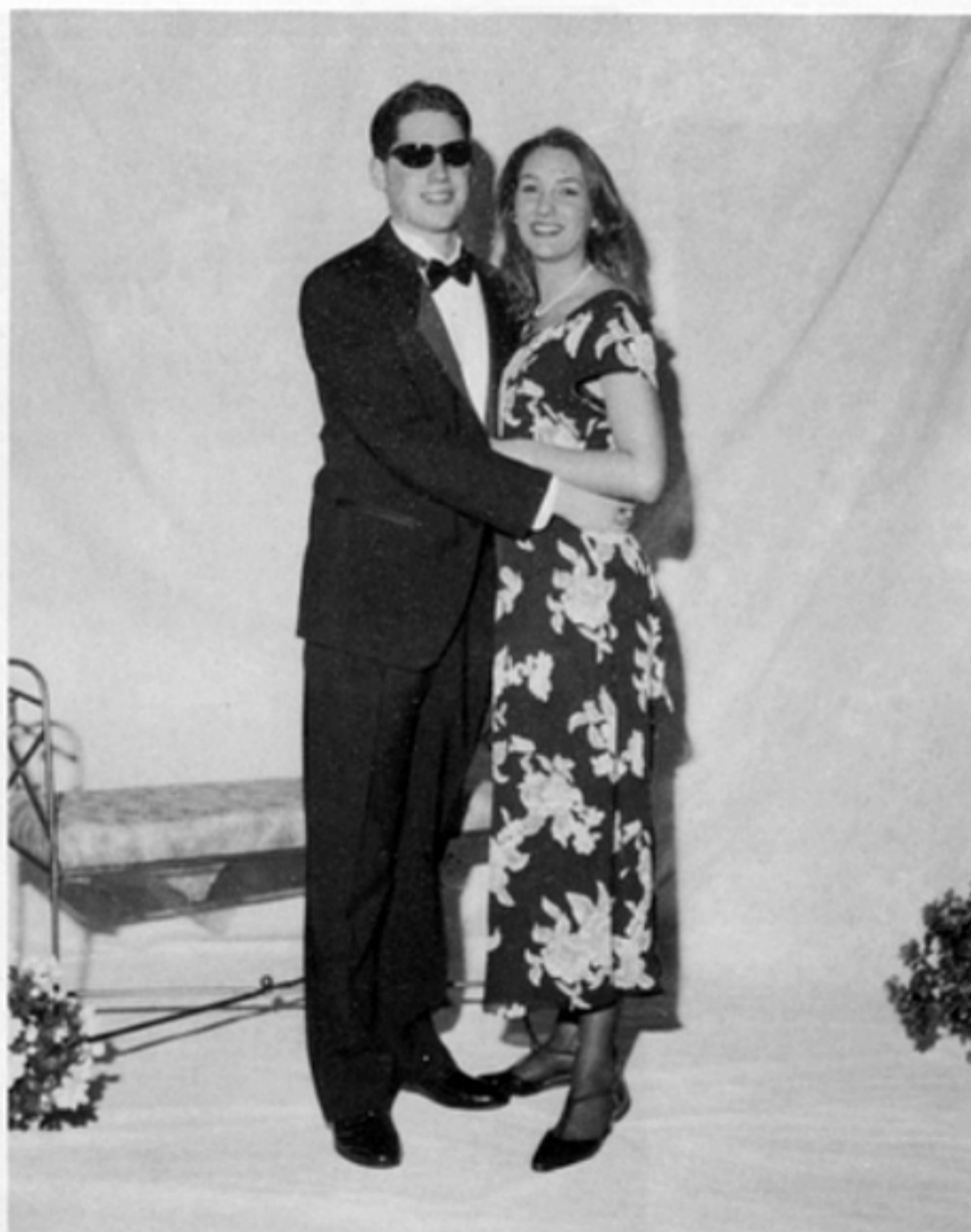
This year's Lilac Princess, Shannon Snow, was crowned in the L.C. Auditorium on March 18.

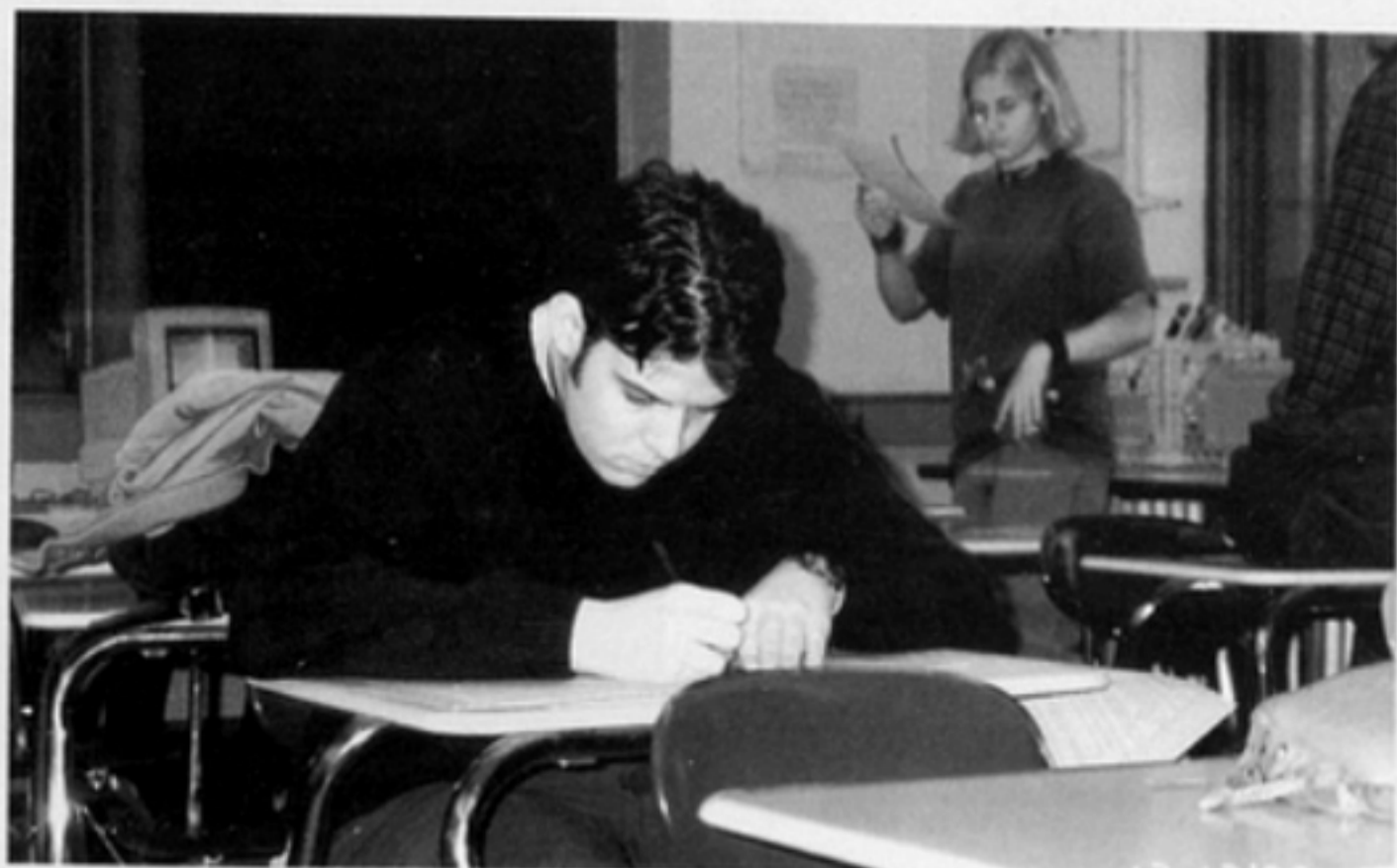
