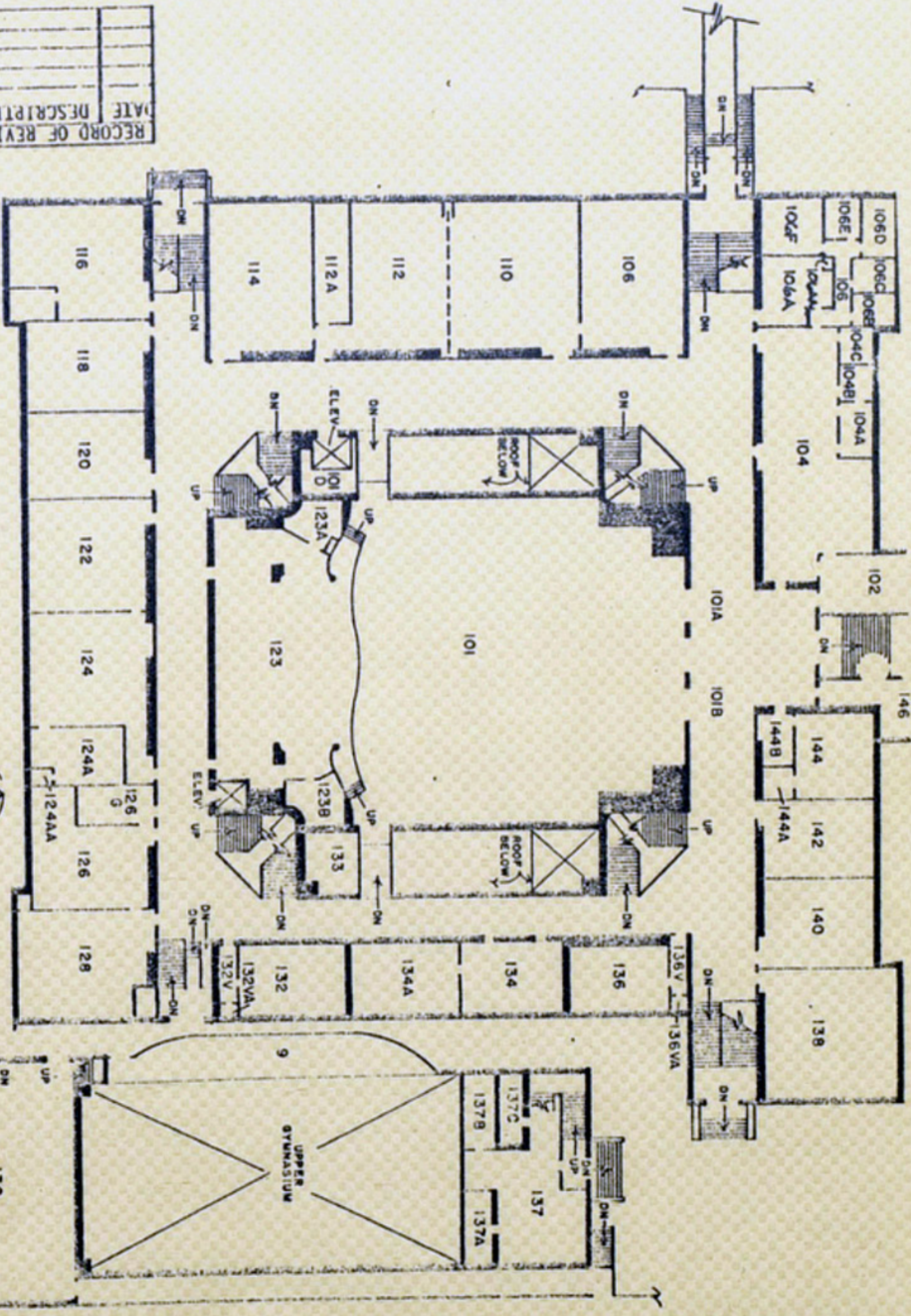

SCALE: 1/32" = 1'-0"

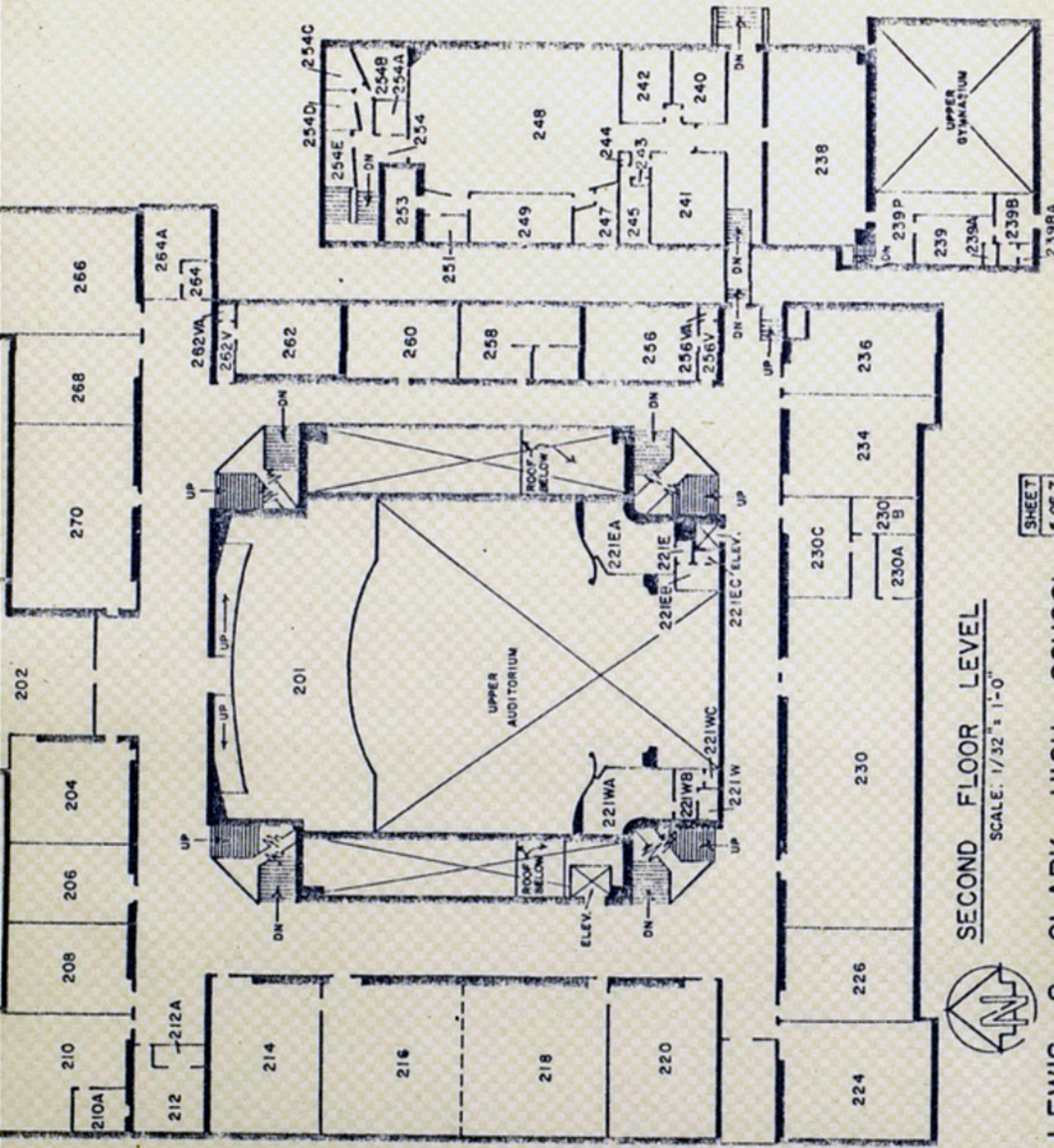

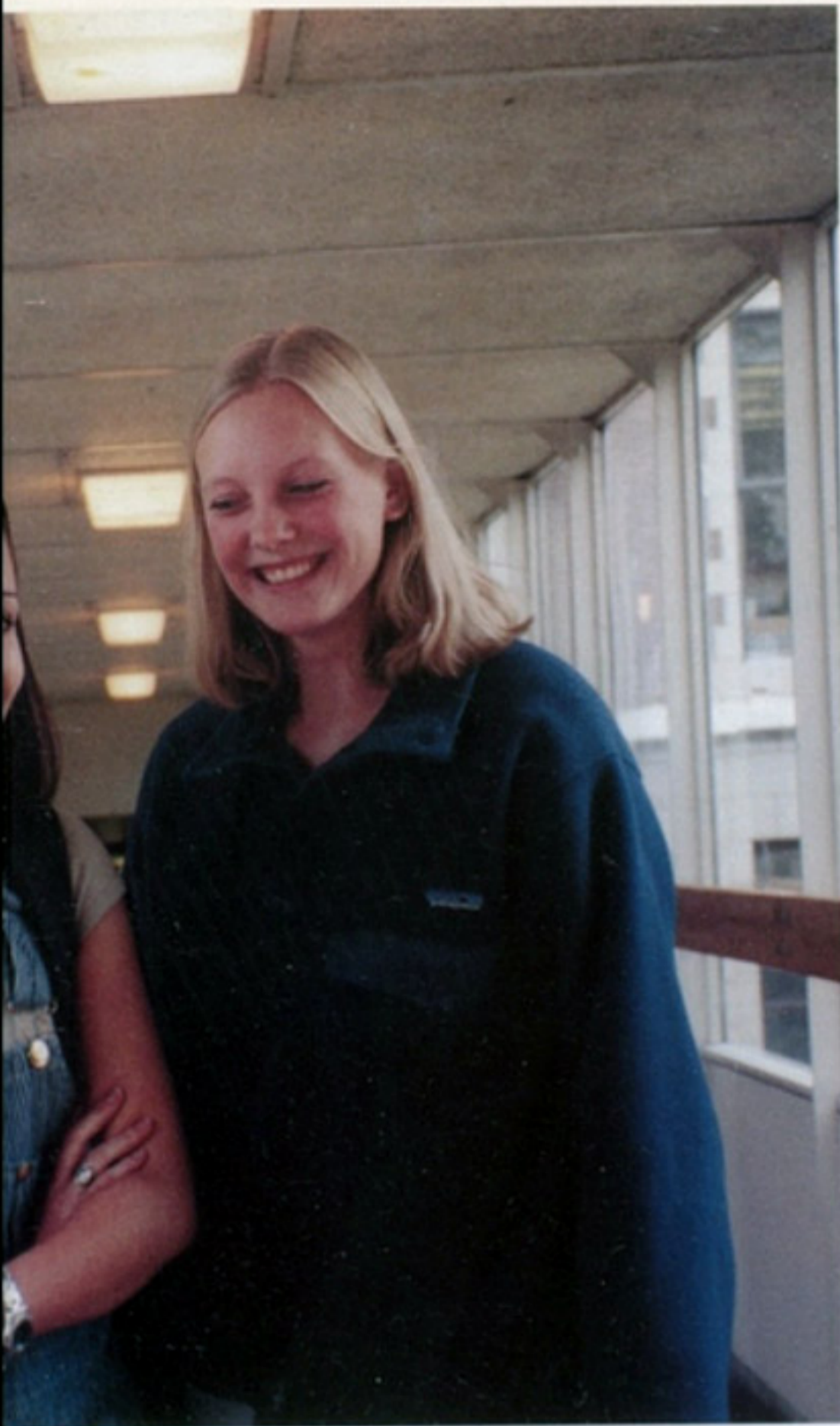

Also threatened are the open staircases, which may be closed due to fire hazards.

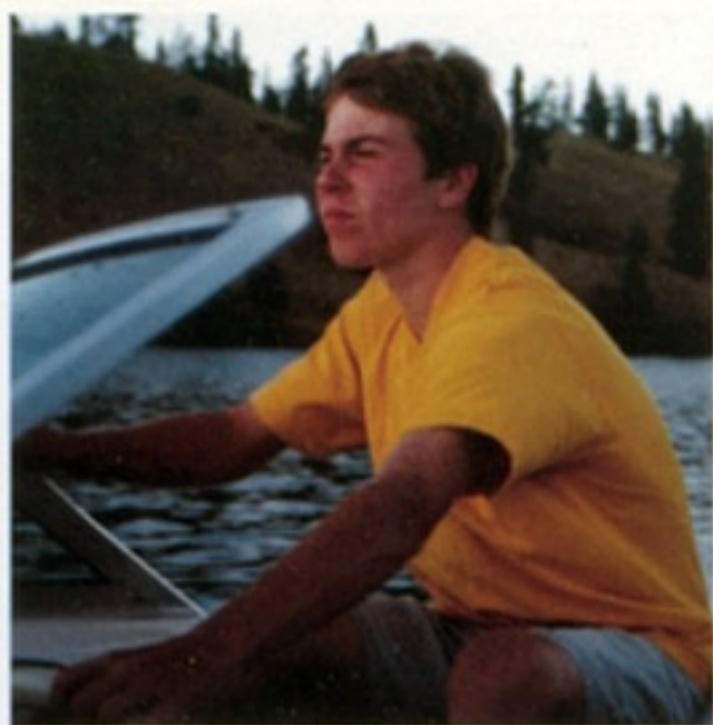

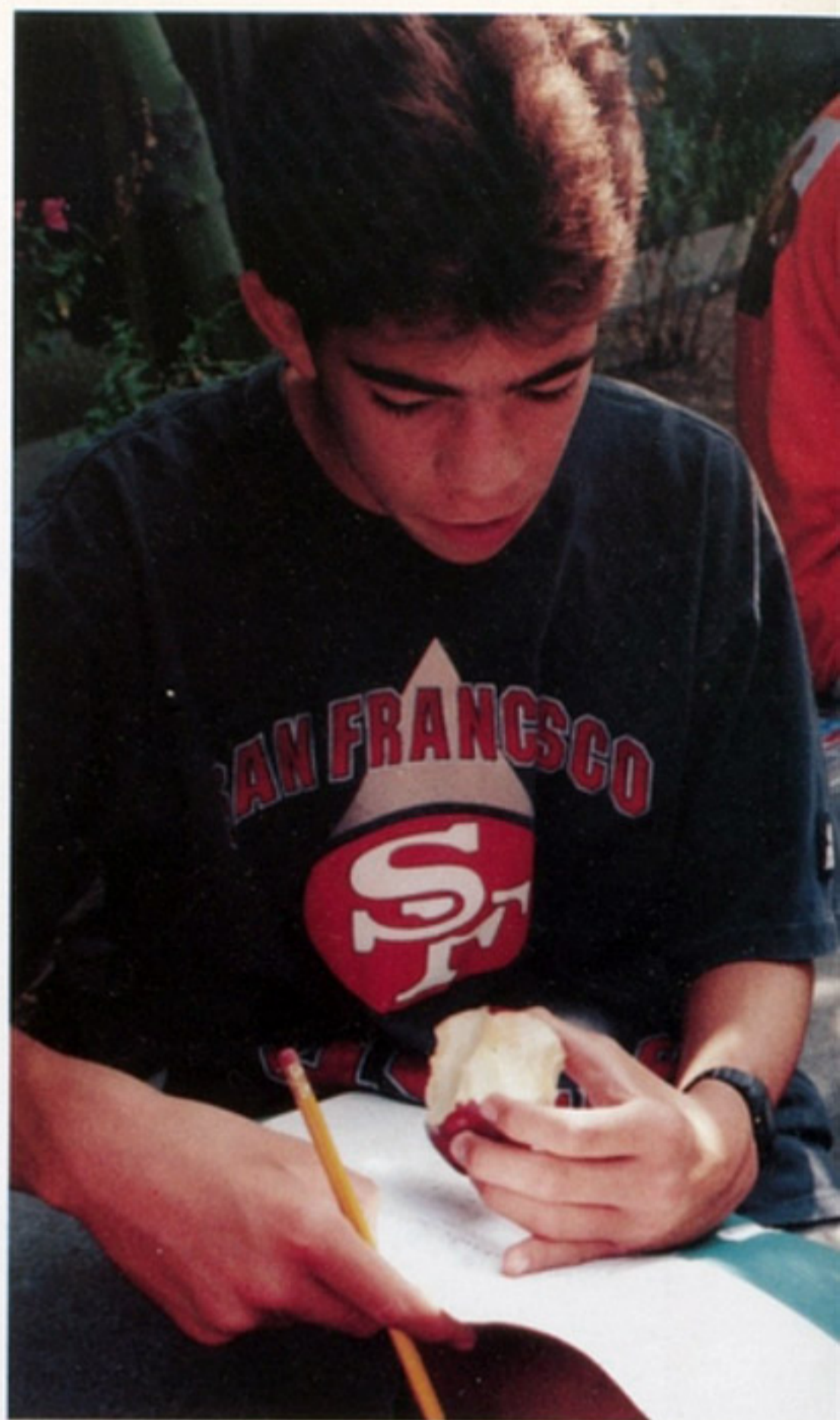

STUDENT LIFE

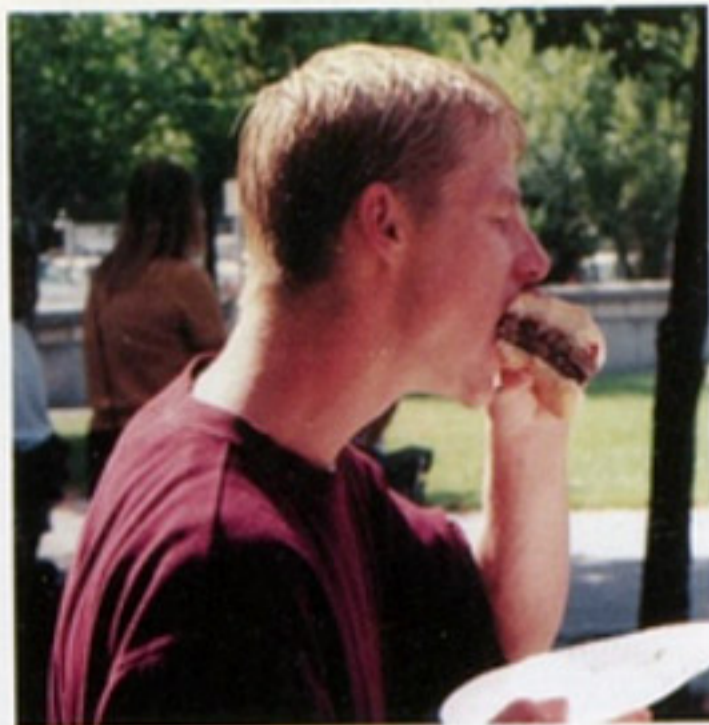

The long past of LC is obvious while walking through the school. Even though the renovation is needed, much of the school's historic charm will be lost.

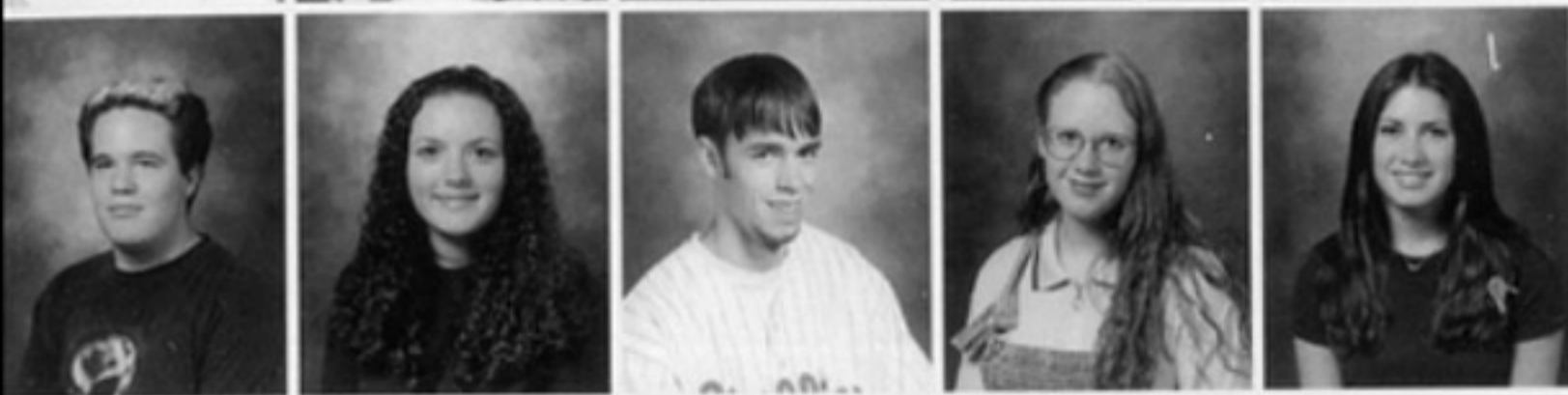

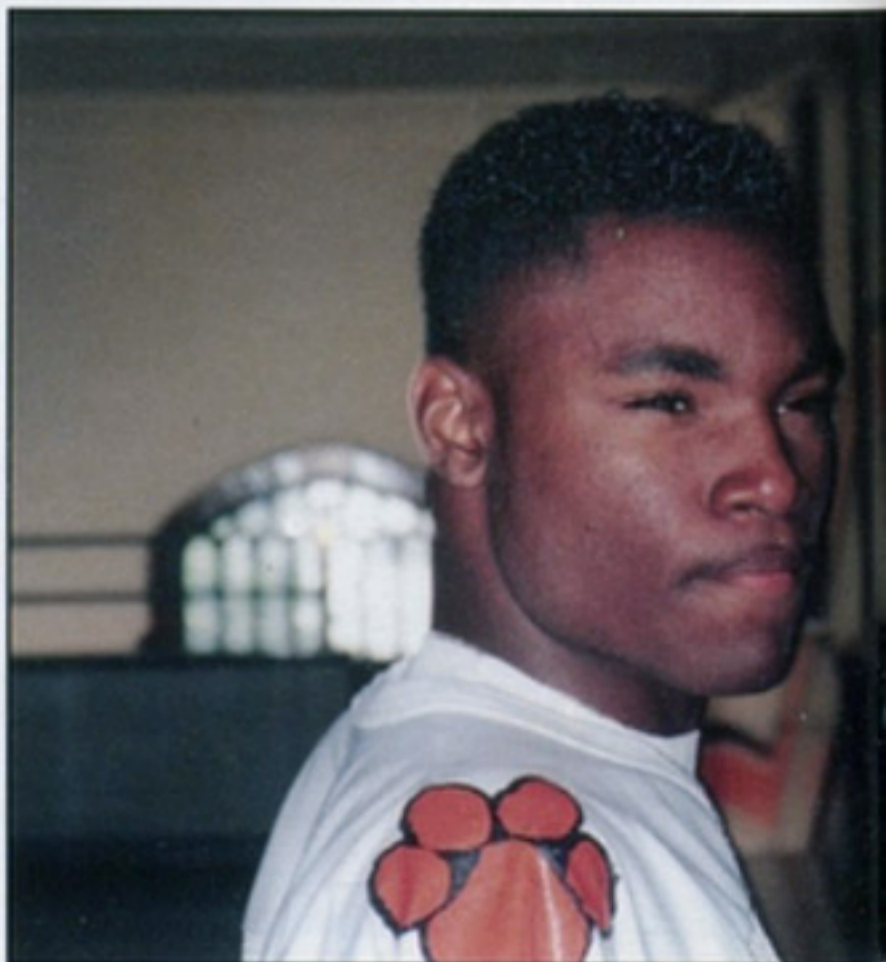

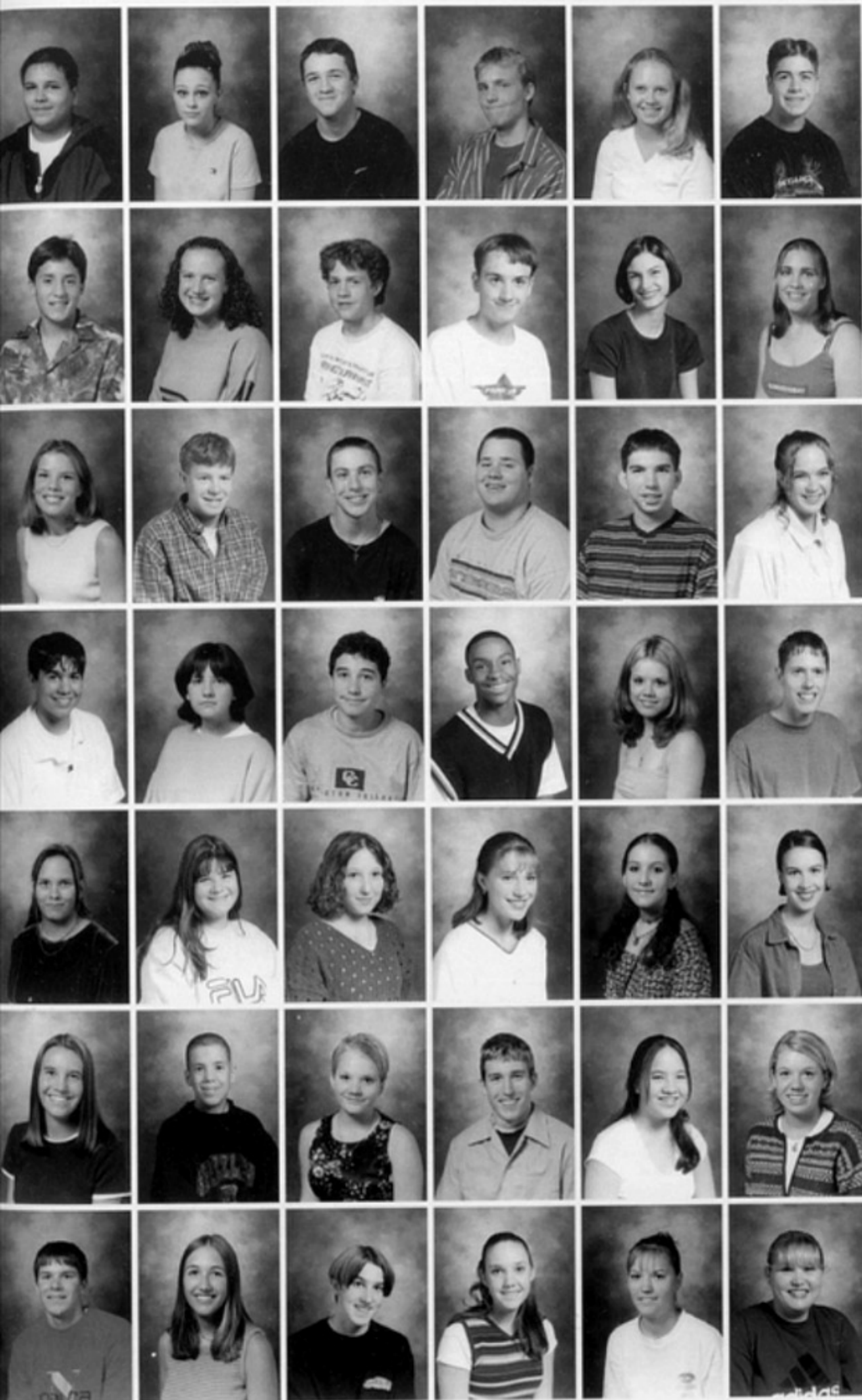
Holley Mason High?

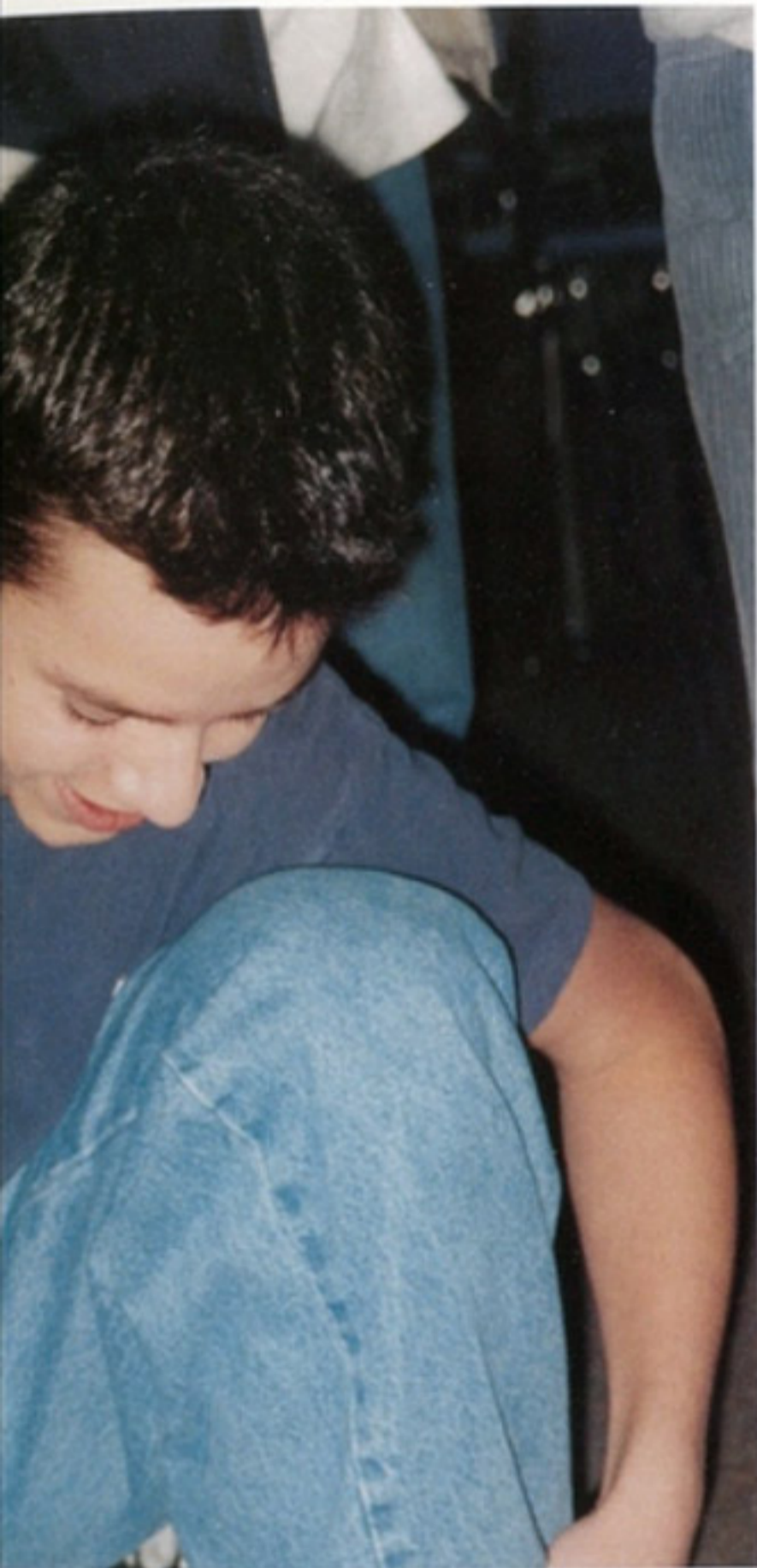

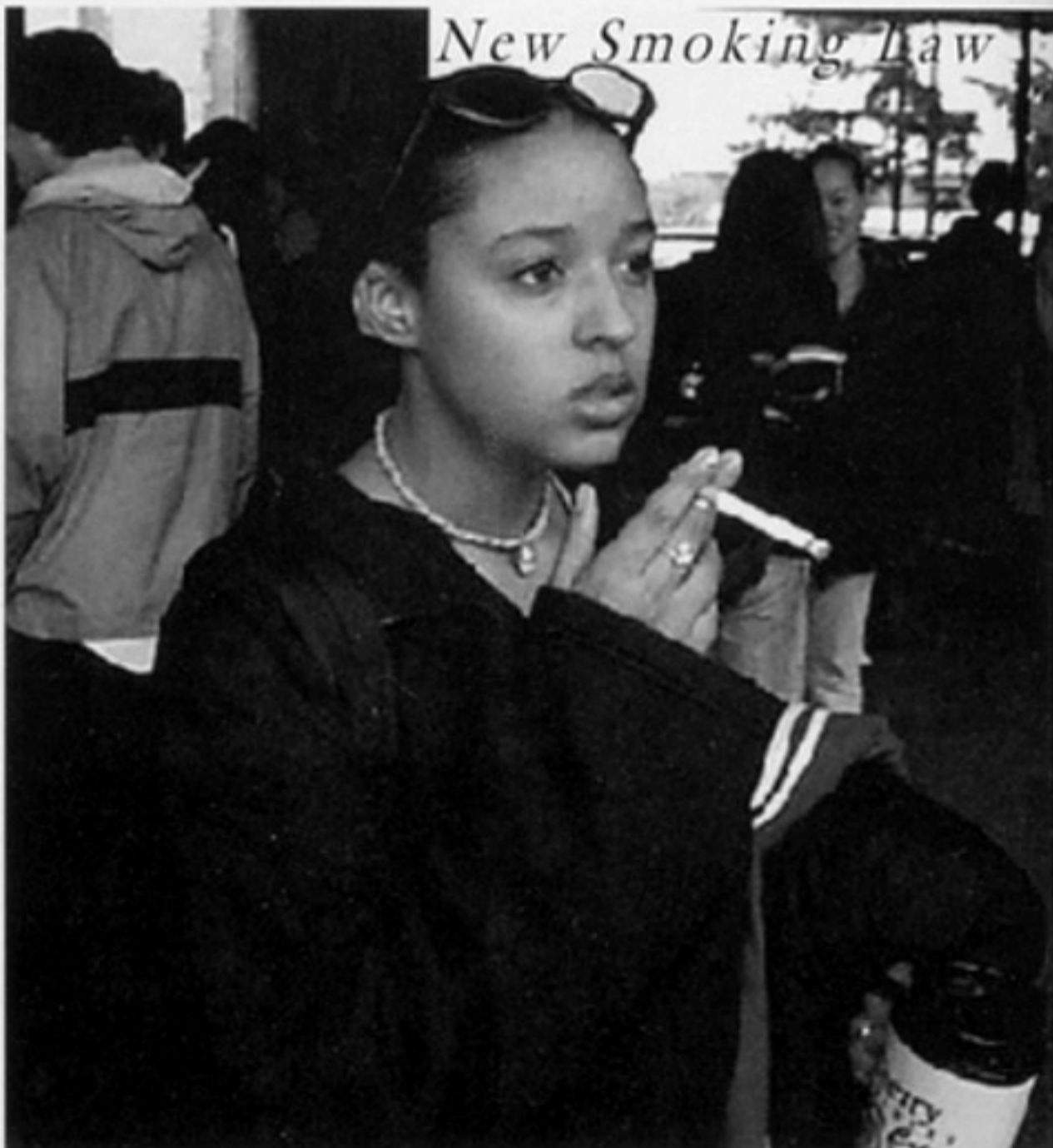

Last June the state legislature passed a new law prohibiting minors from possessing any tobacco product. The new law is designed to educate young people about the dangers of tobacco products. Violation of the law is a class three misdemeanor. A law enforcement officer may stop students at any time and ask for their name, date of birth, and home address. Students cited by an officer may be required to attend a 'no-smoking' class and may be required to perform five hours of assigned public service. There will also be penalties for possessing tobacco on school grounds. For the first offense the student will receive a two day suspension and will have to attend four tobacco education intervention classes. The second offense will result in long-term suspension. Smokers seem to have the same response, they hate the new law. Michelle Wilbourn thinks "It is stupid and we will continue to smoke even if we are cited." Chenae Jenkins remarked "If we want to smoke we should be able to. It's our bodies and we make the decisions on what we do with it." Erin Butler said "The new law is taking our rights away."

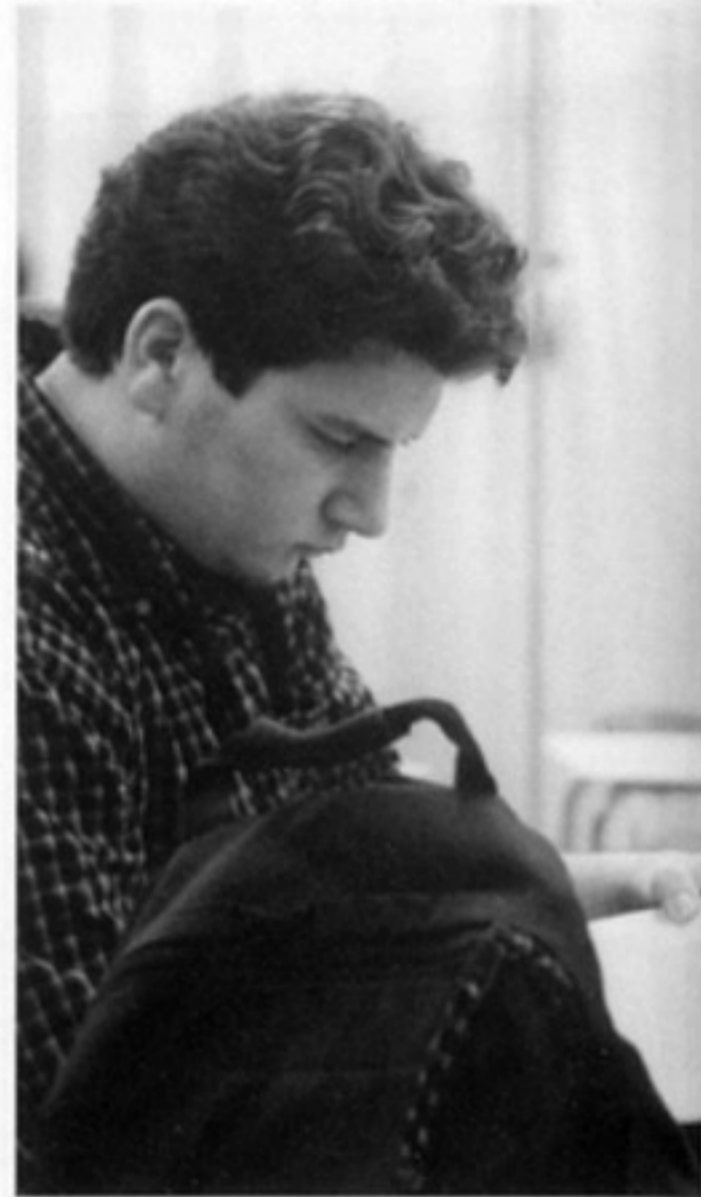

The assorted ensembles in band include Jazz Band, Pep Band, Marching Band, the now nationally-known Cowboy Brass Band, and the Wind Ensemble.

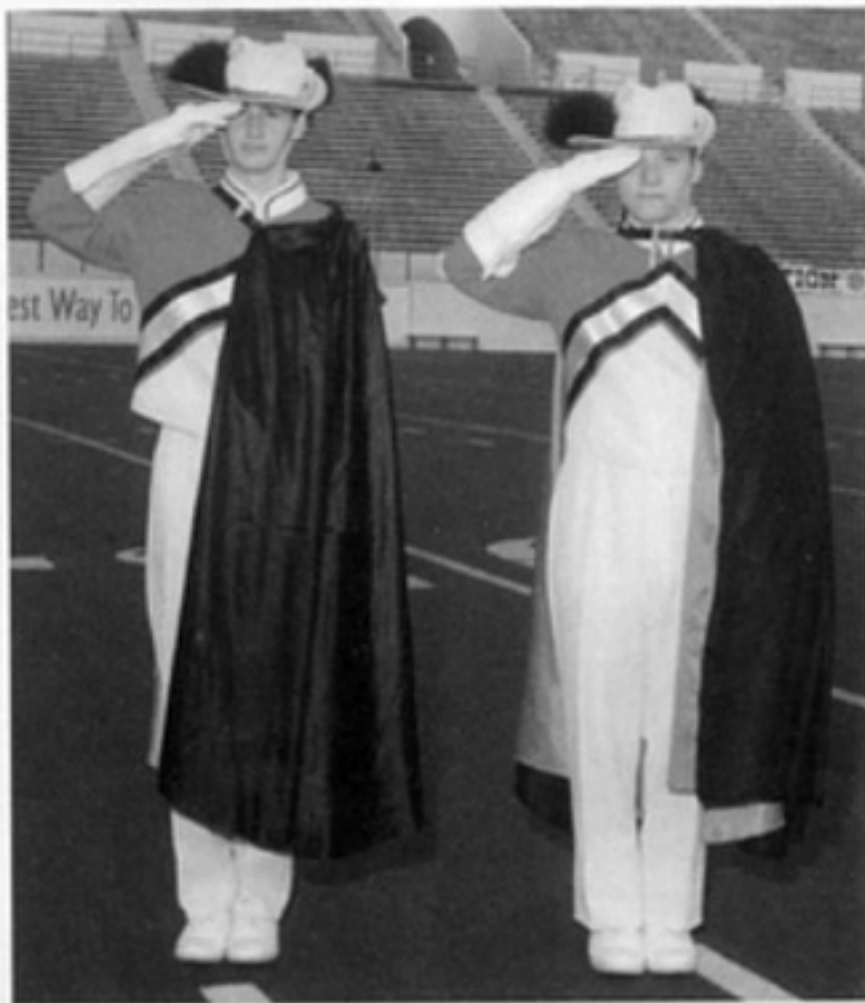
This year's senior class is one of great accomplishments and talent. In the last two years they have sent more musicians to the All-State and All-Northwest conferences than ever before.

Skills Center



Skills Center is a technical-professional school that is offered to students in 9 districts. The courses offered help students develop skill competencies necessary for success in post high school training or direct employment.

To attend Skills Center you must be between the ages of 16 and 21, and have completed a minimum of 6 credits. Students attend 3 periods a day, which earns them 1.5 credits in a semester. 28 students attend Skills Center from LC taking courses that range from Automotive Technology to Dental Assisting.

This year the Automotive Technology program has been certified by the Automotive Technicians Education Foundation. This means that students in automotive classes can be certified and ready to go directly into the work field without further education.

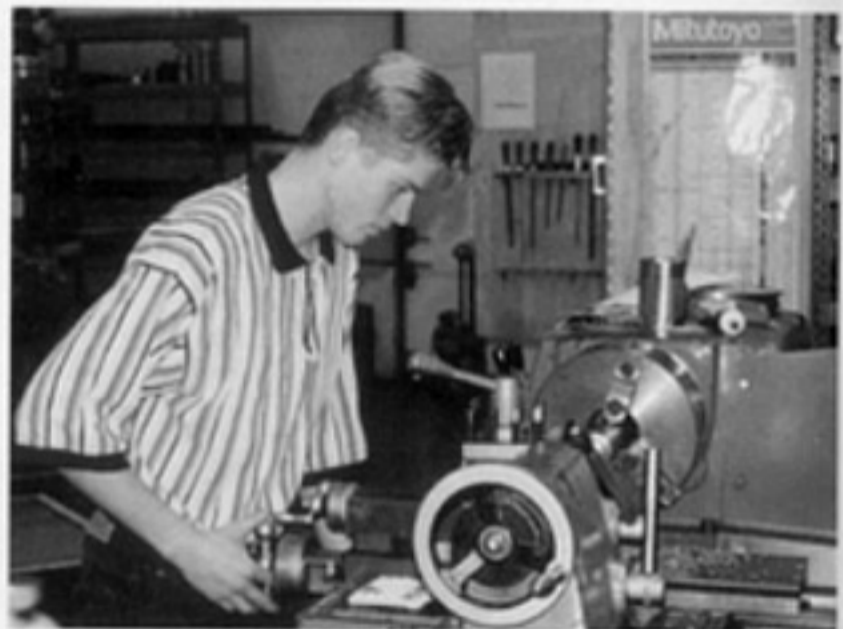

Food Service

Due to popular demand, the Food Service Cooperative class has expanded their business. In addition to having two classes instead of one, the class bought an espresso cart which offers most of the popular espresso drinks at a competitive price. Mrs. Mahan said "I am pleased about giving students the opportunity to have school to work experiences. The espresso cart has given them the skills to start a business and be involved in all aspects of the job." The students run, maintain, and stock the cart. The students must also have a job outside of school and record their hours to receive an extra credit per year. The classes combined have about forty members. They learn skills related to the food service industry. To raise money they sold candy grams, cookies, muffins, peanut brittle and other snacks. They also have pre-paid cards for the espresso cart. The class gave back to the community by adopting a family for Christmas, supplying them with food, clothes and gifts.

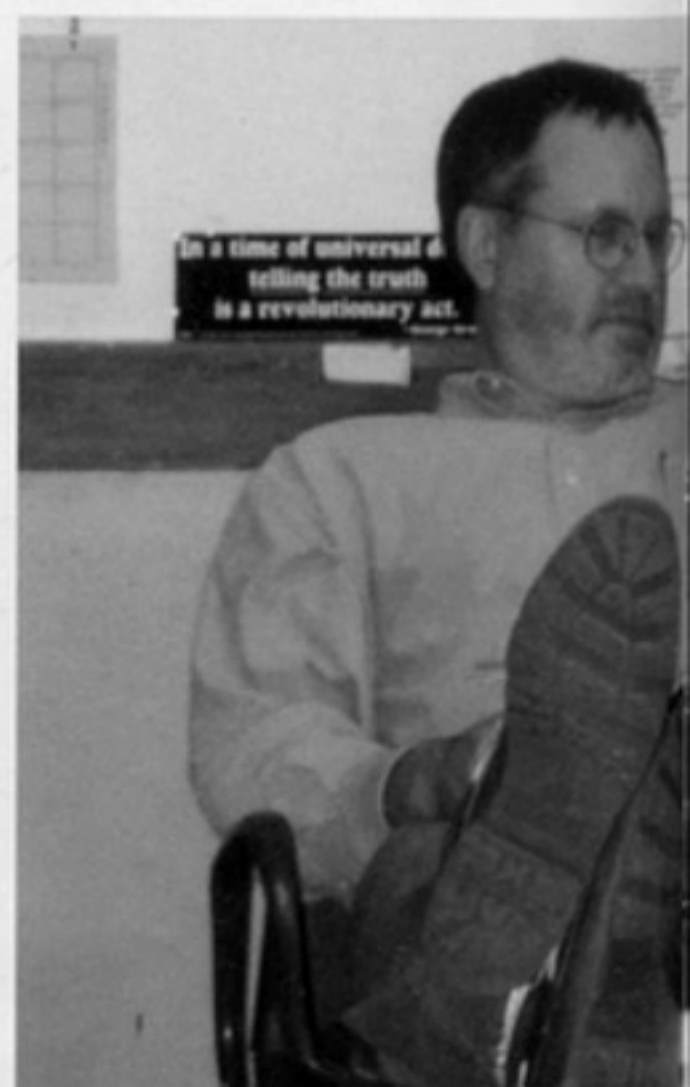

Math TEAM

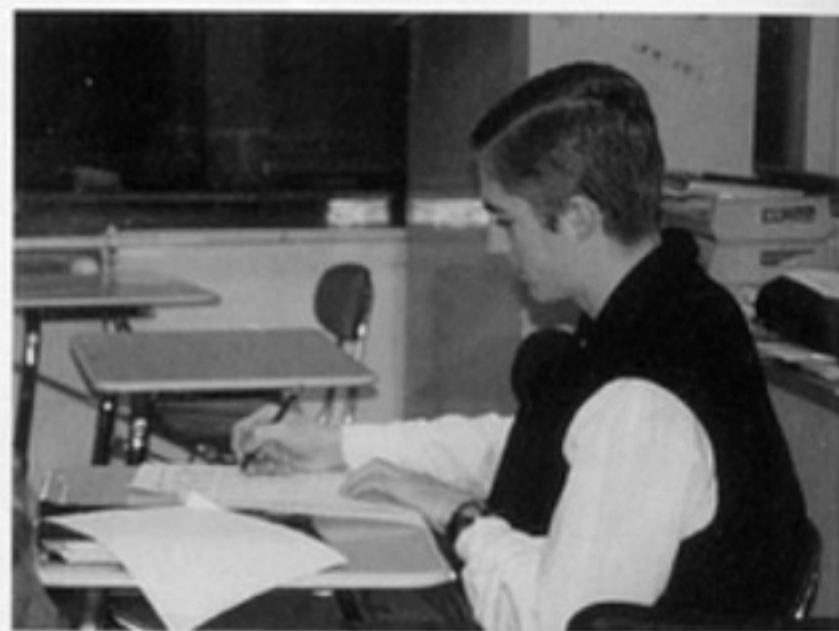

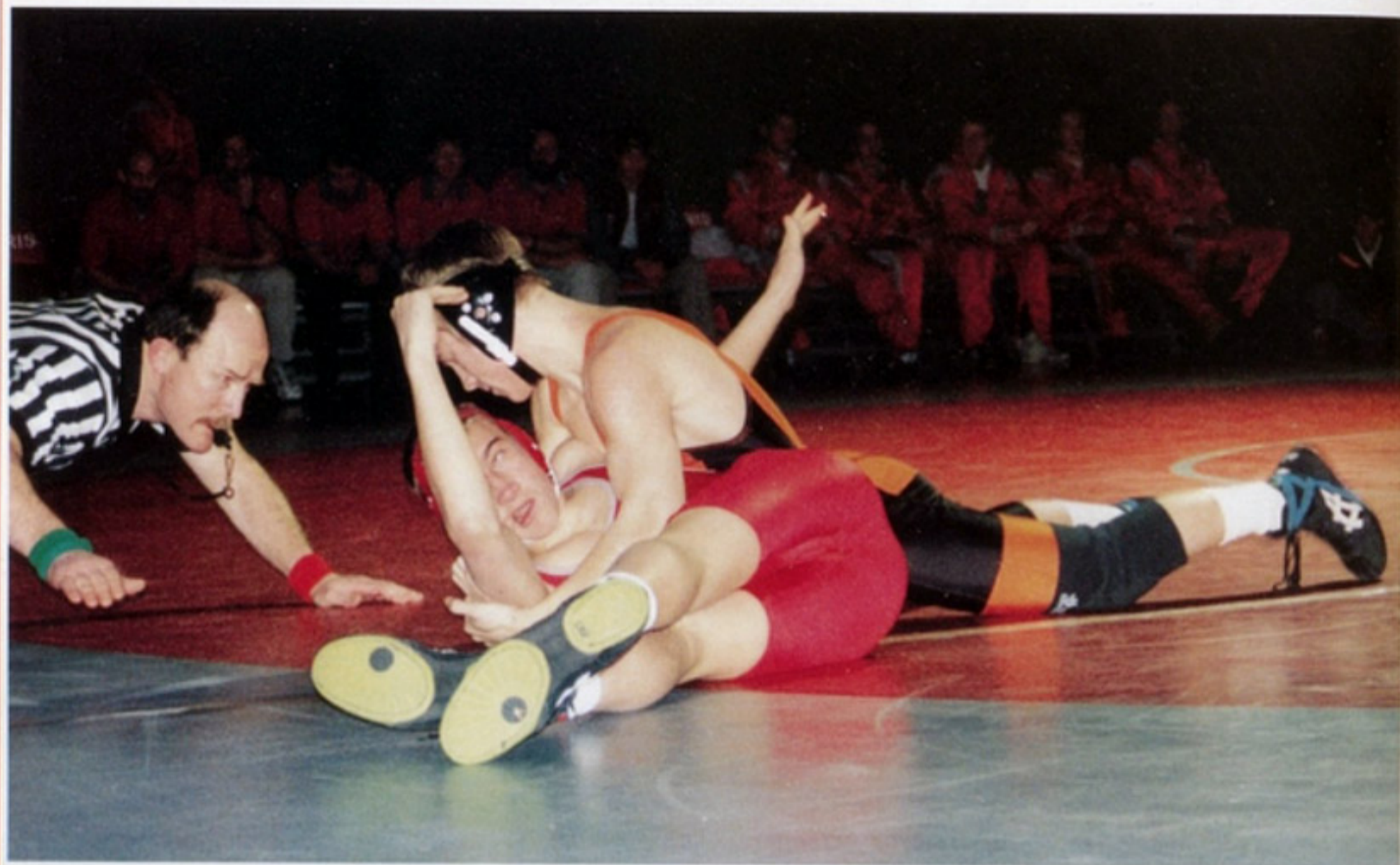

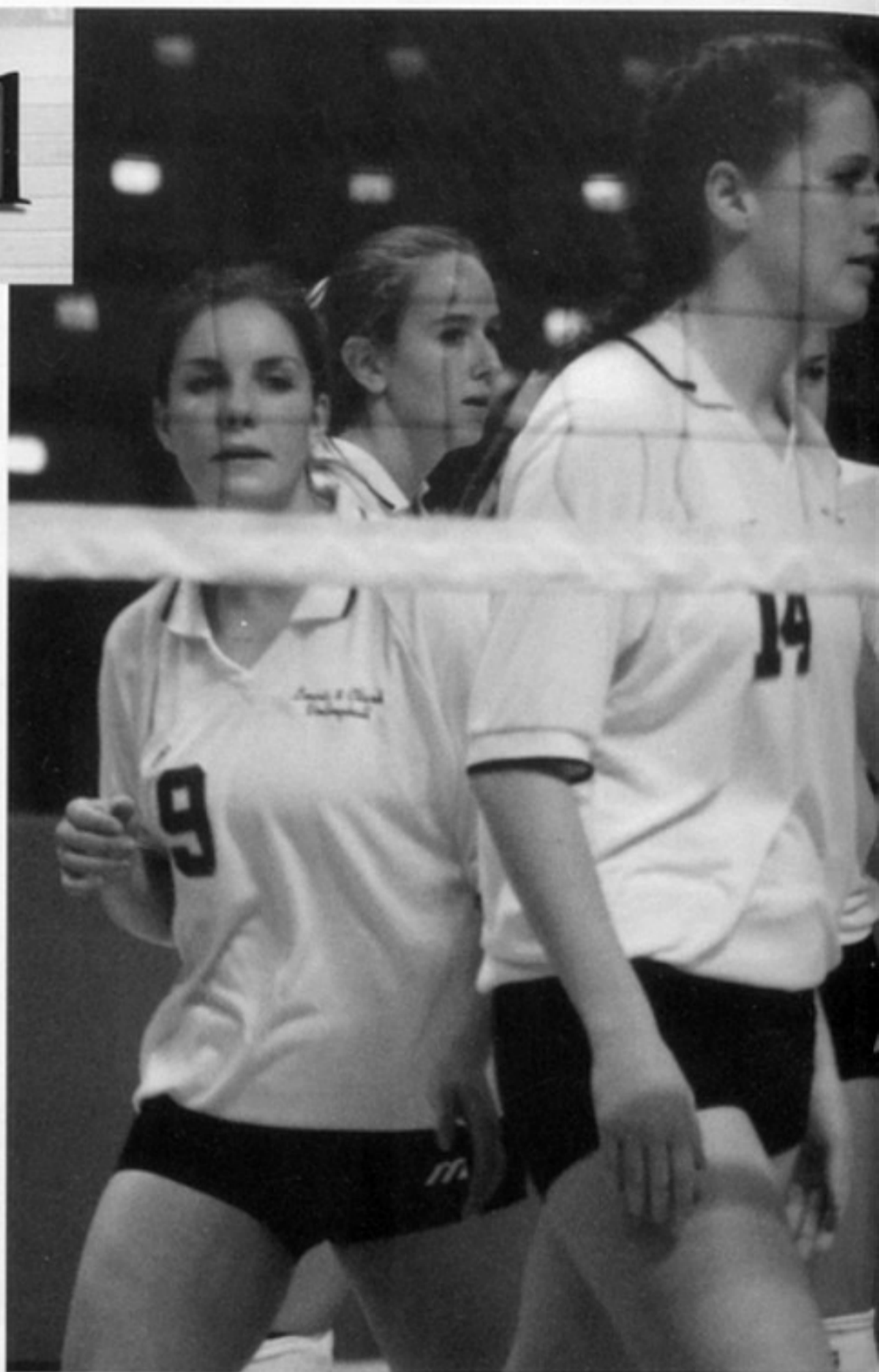


Volleyball

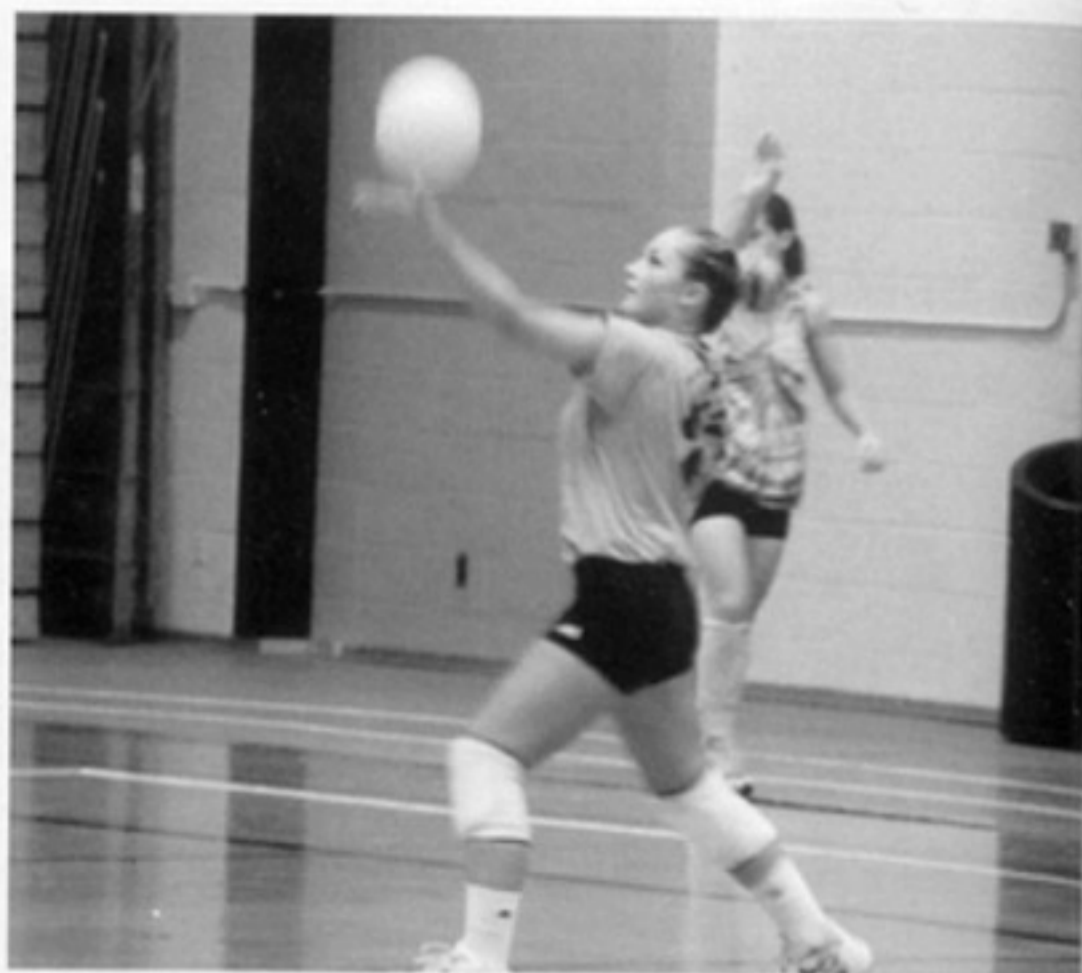

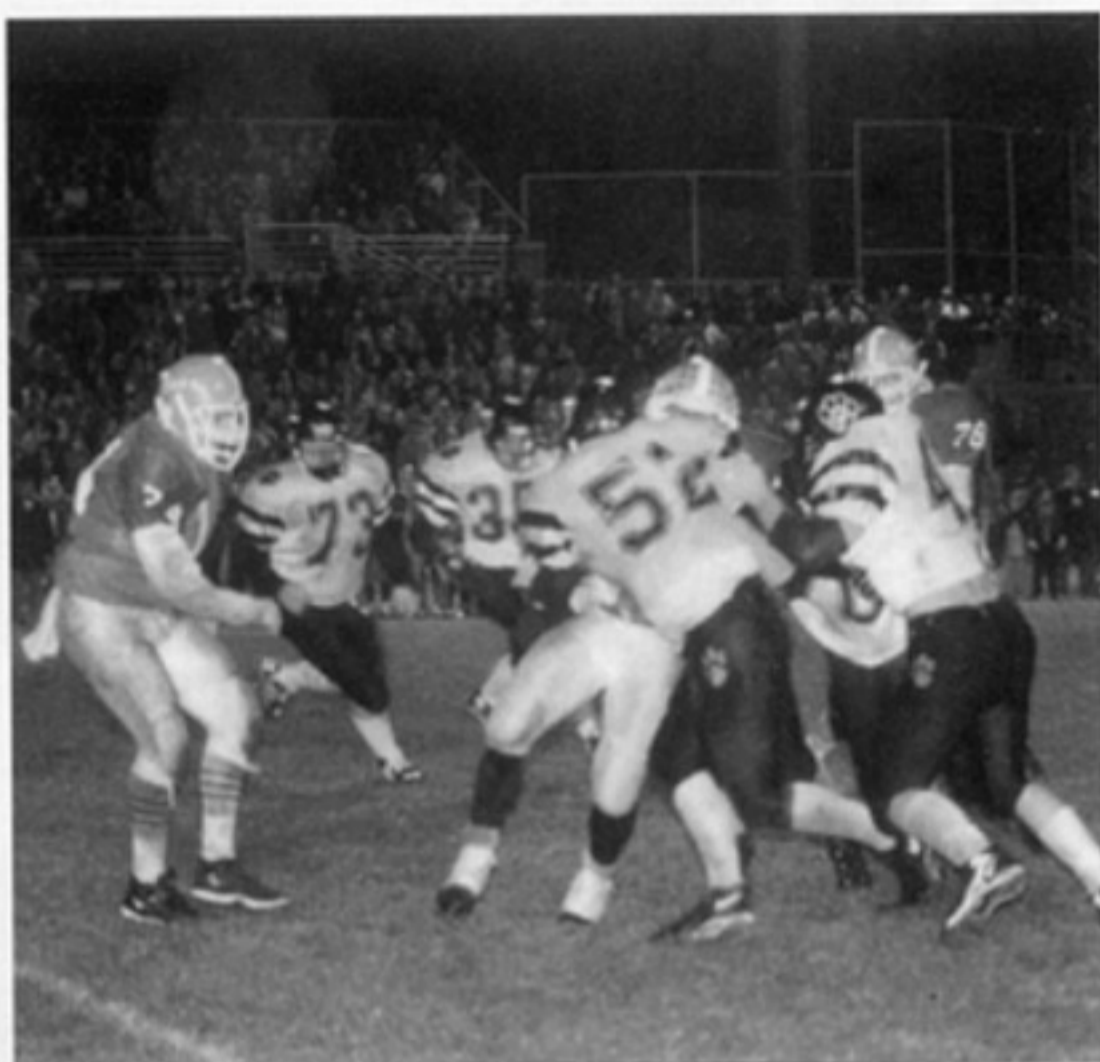

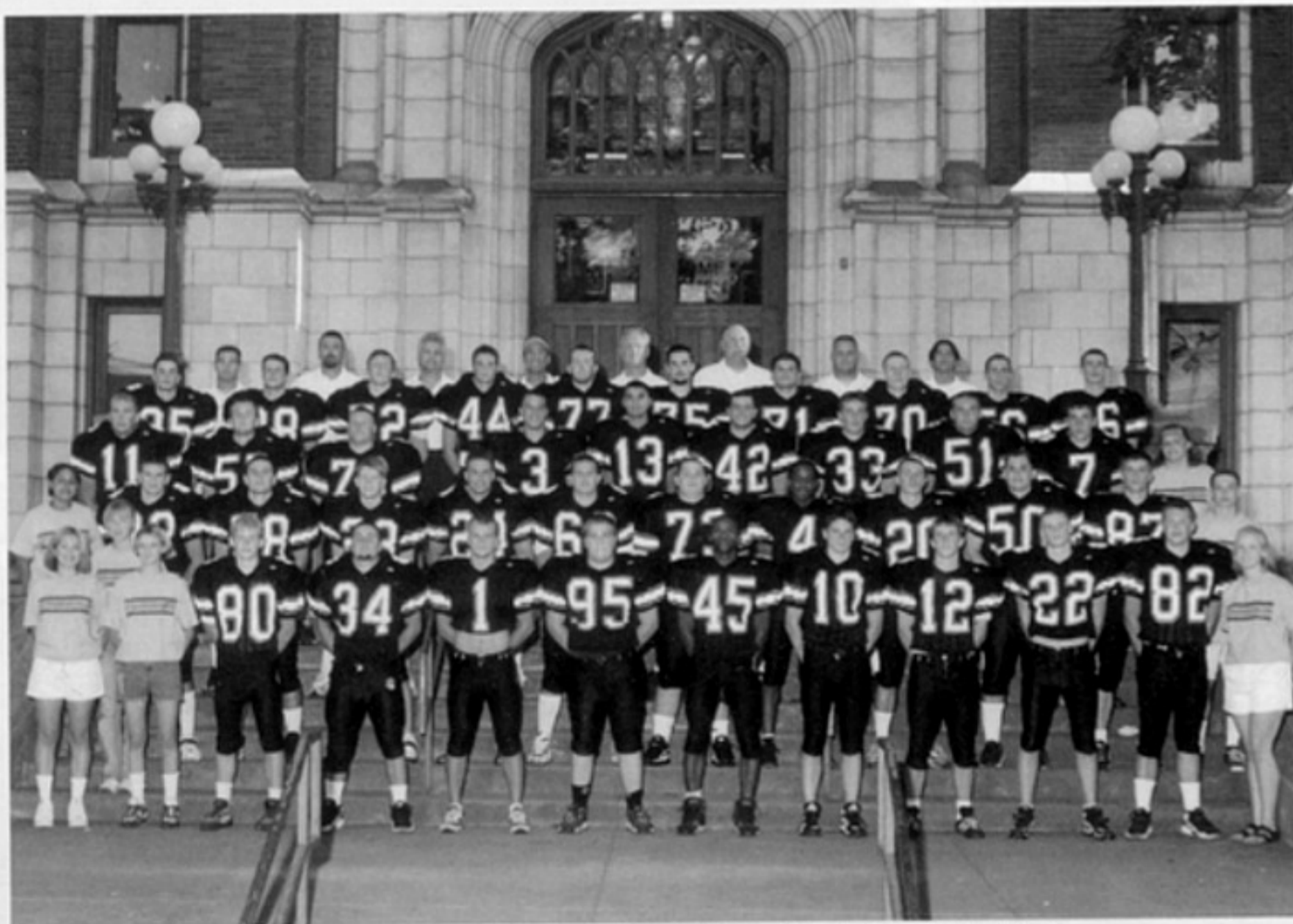


Left: Nick Spurgetis breaks away from the defenders on the way to a big yardage gain as Ty Dinneen races over to make the block.

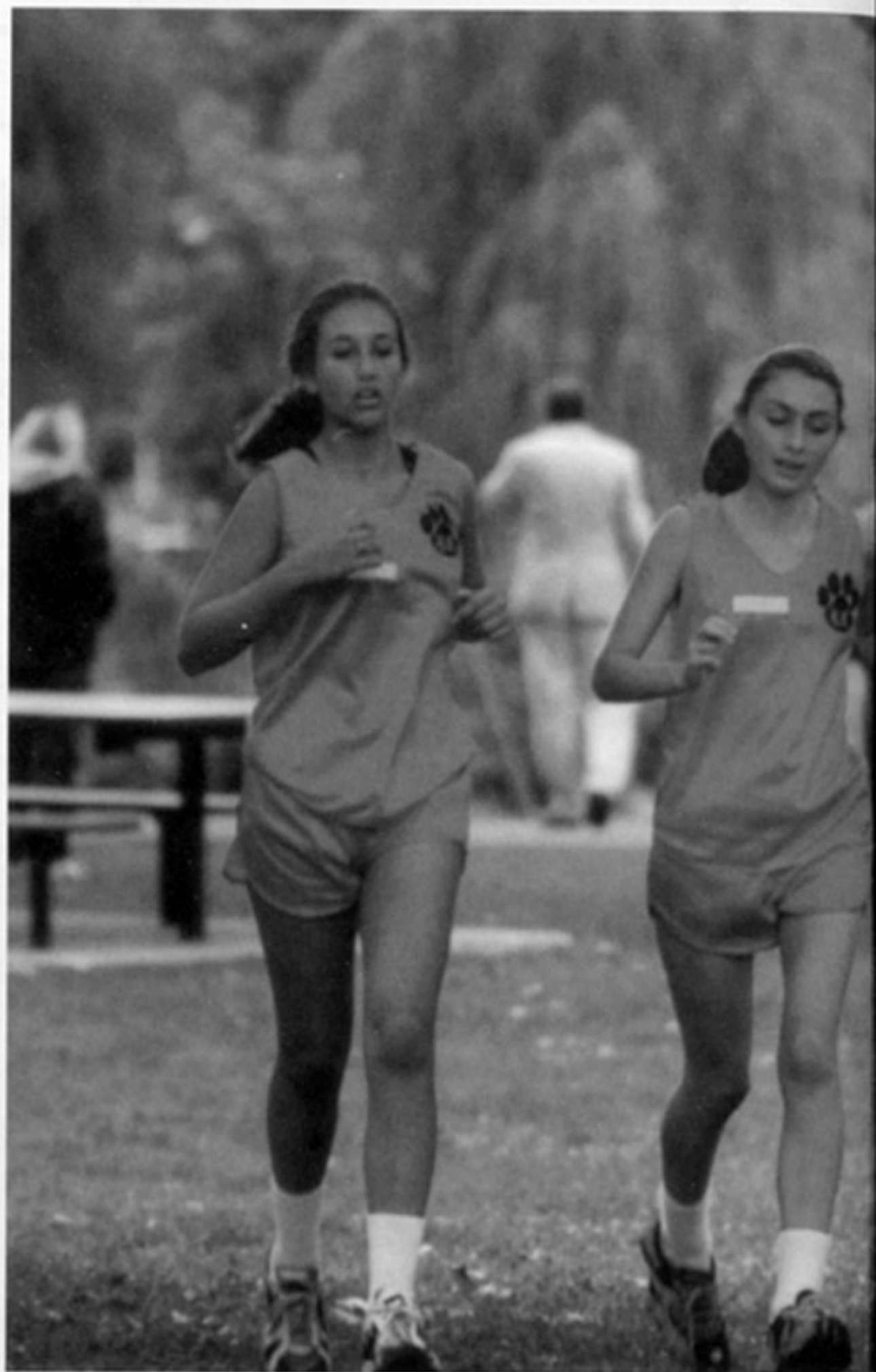

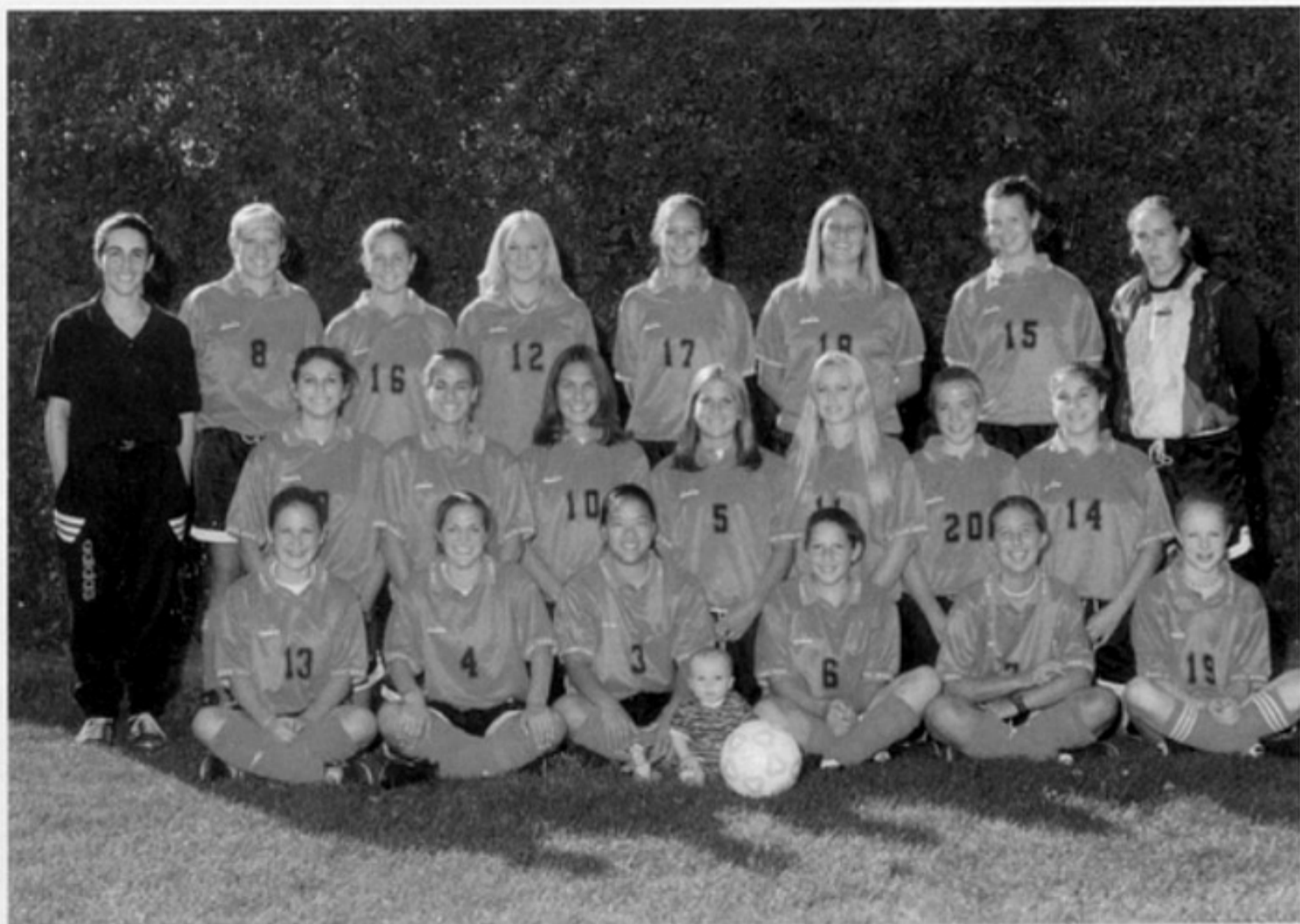

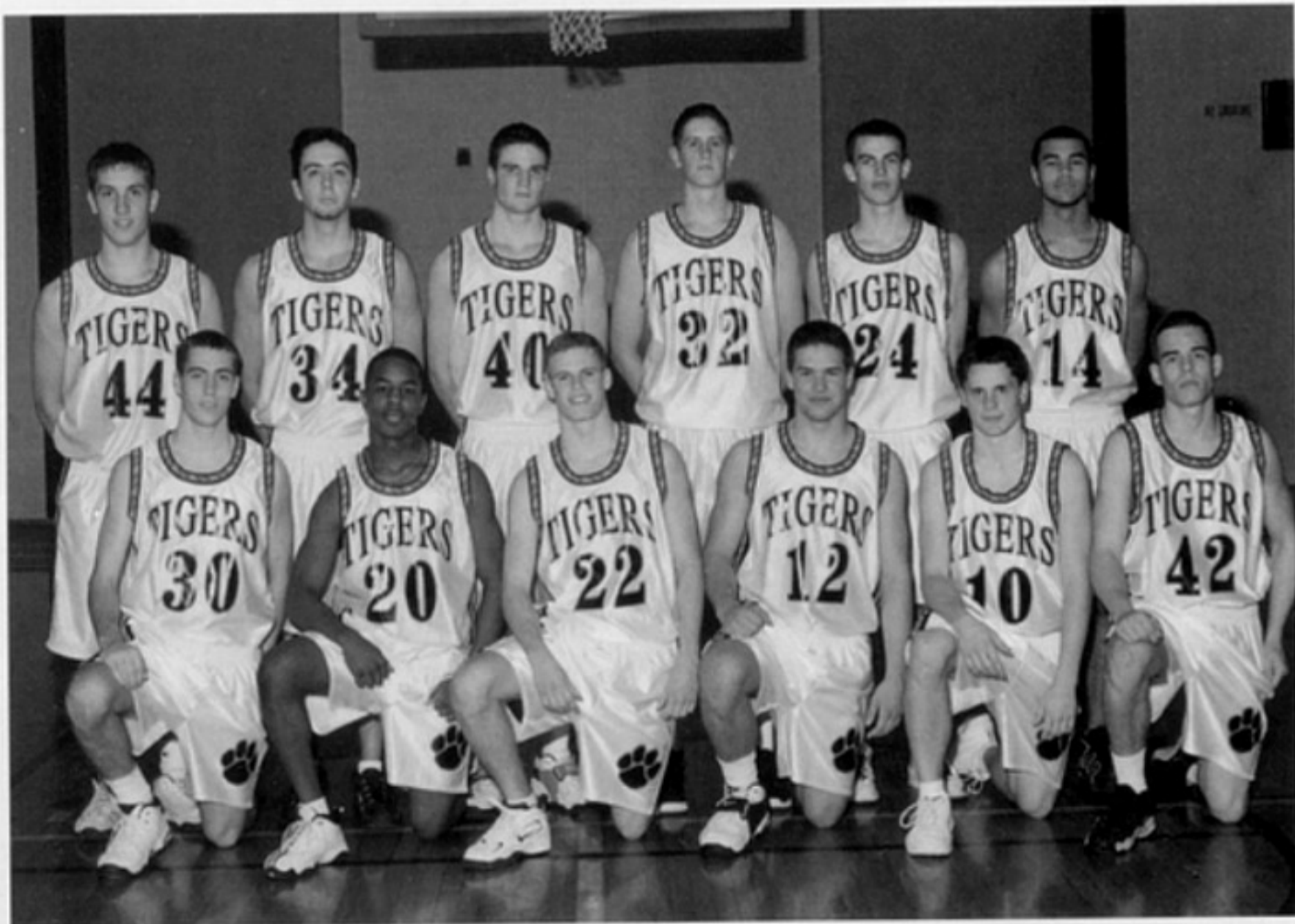

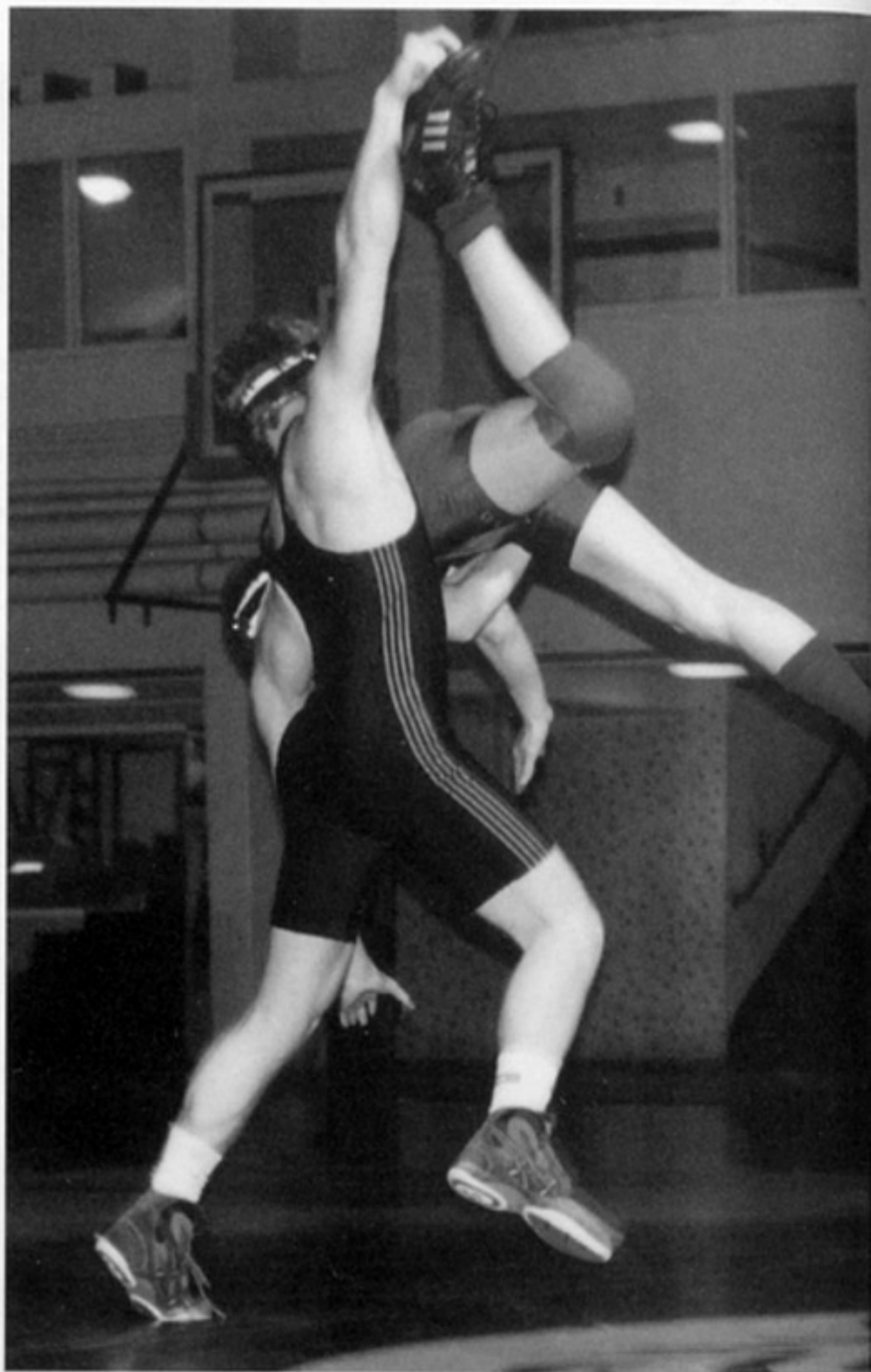

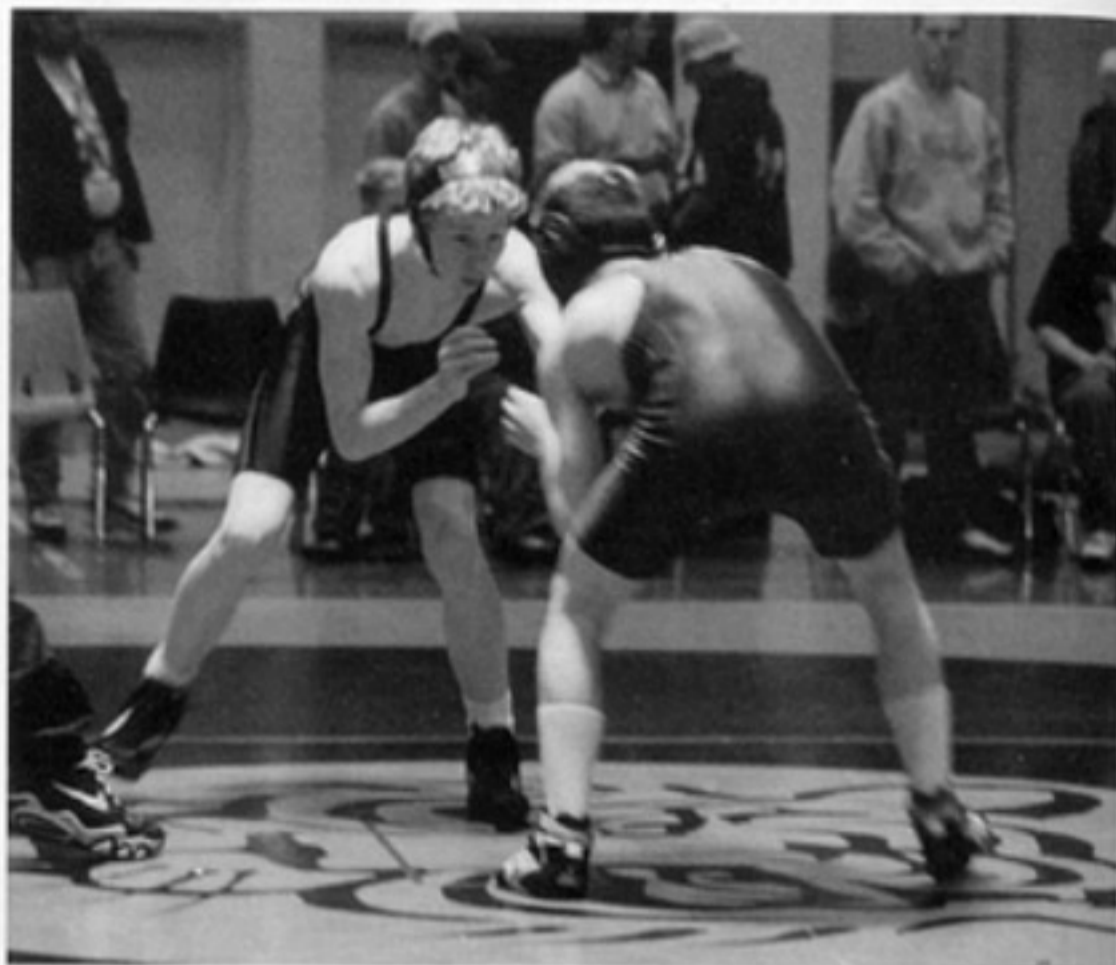

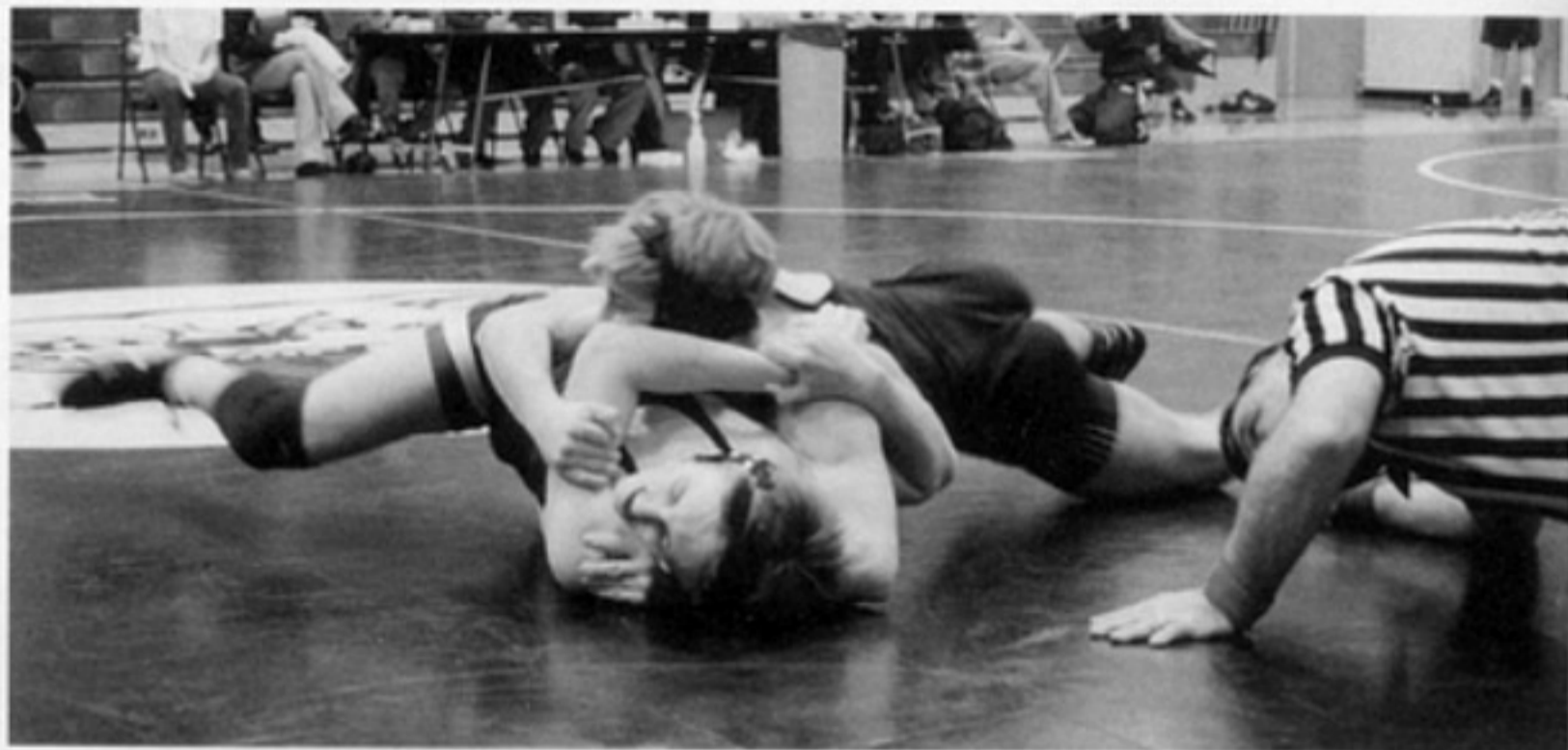

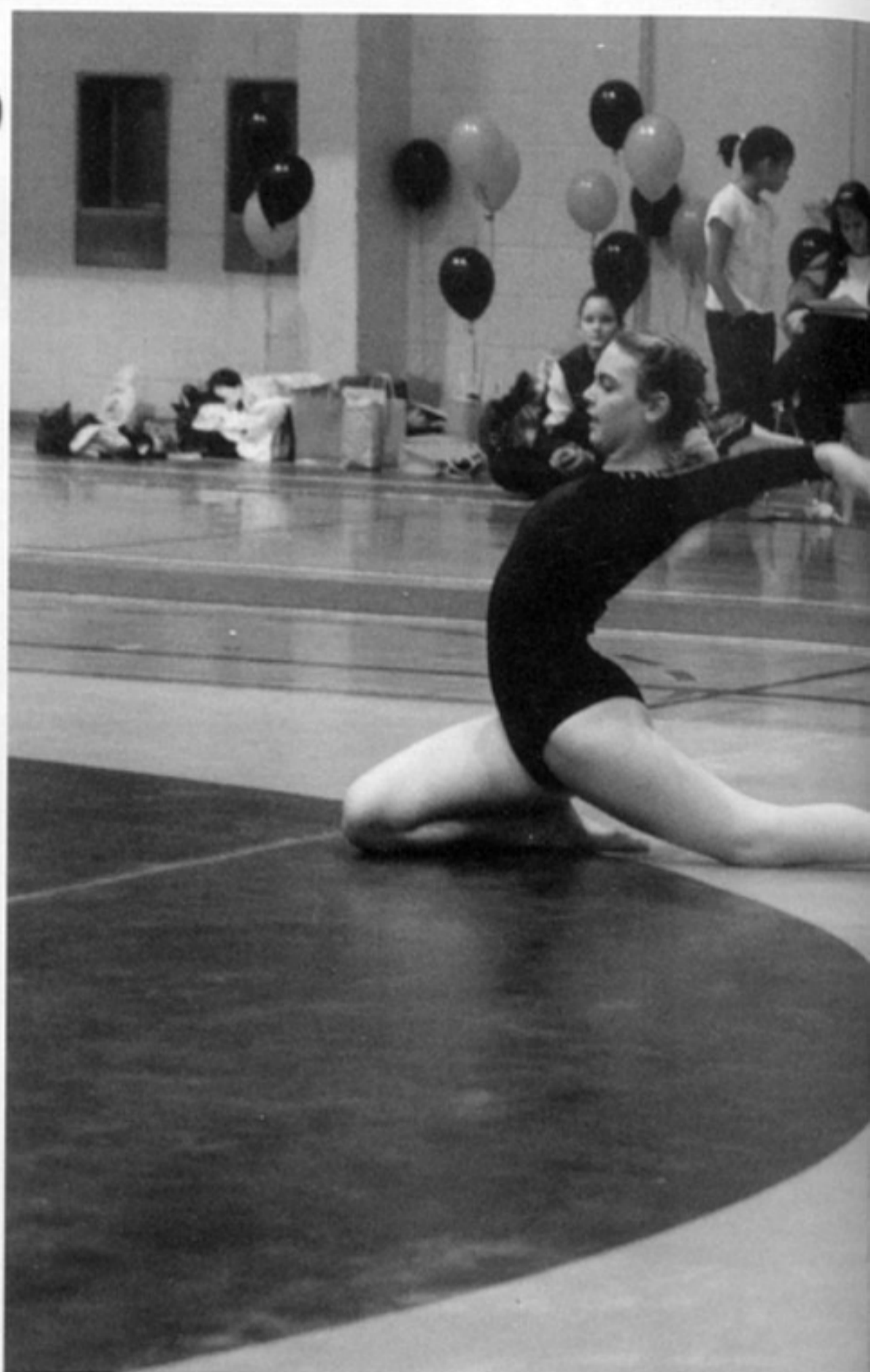

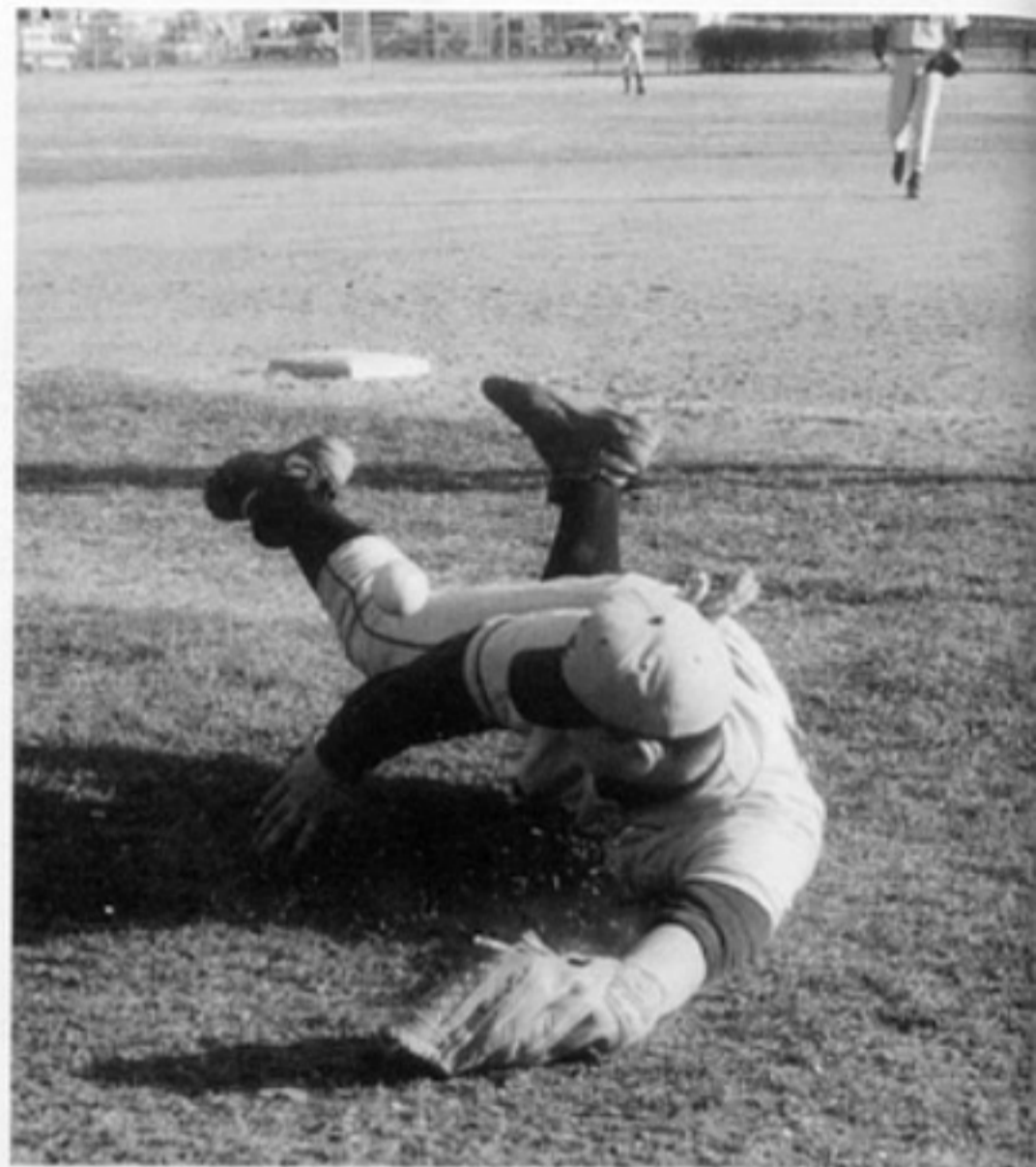

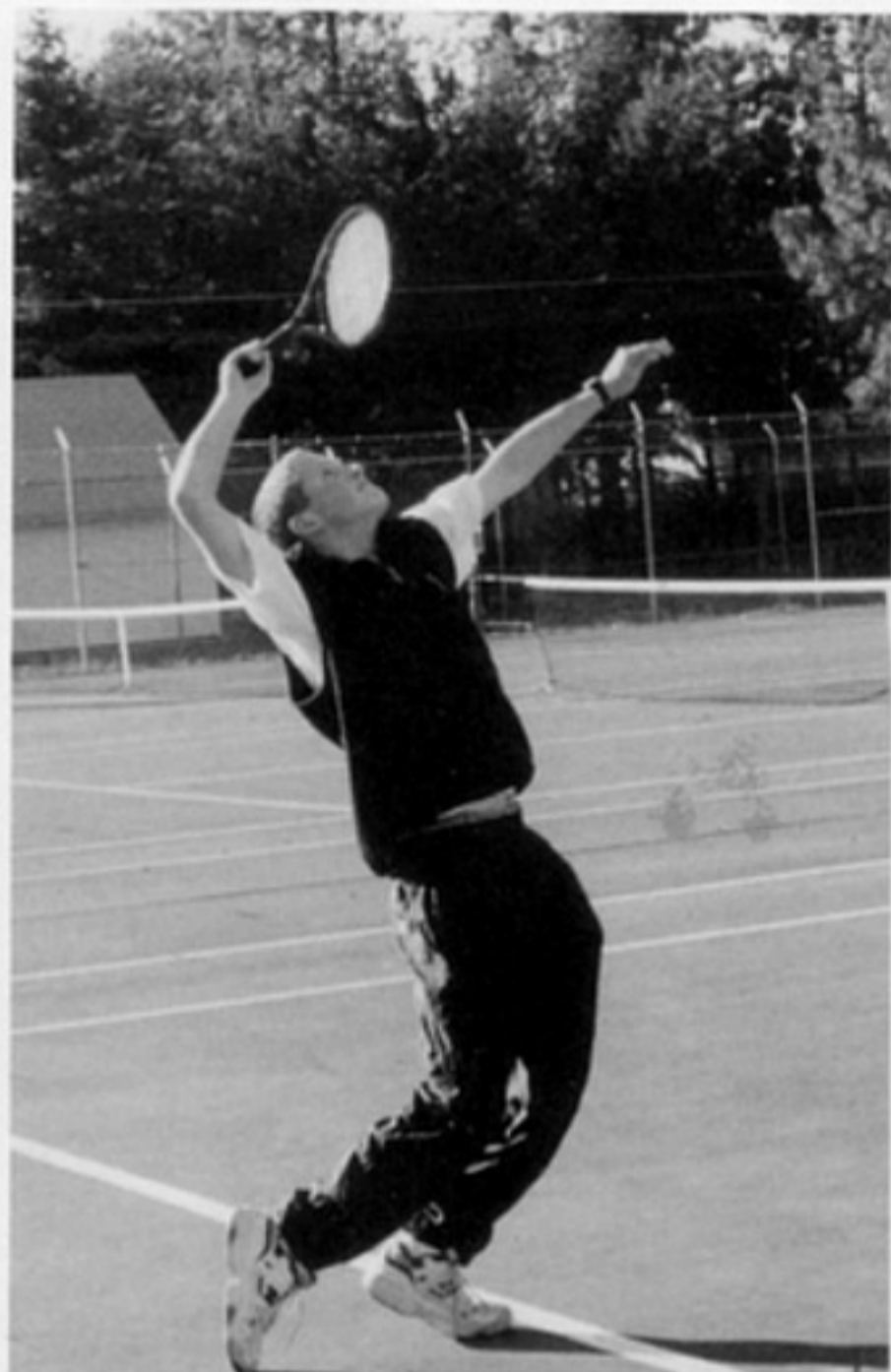

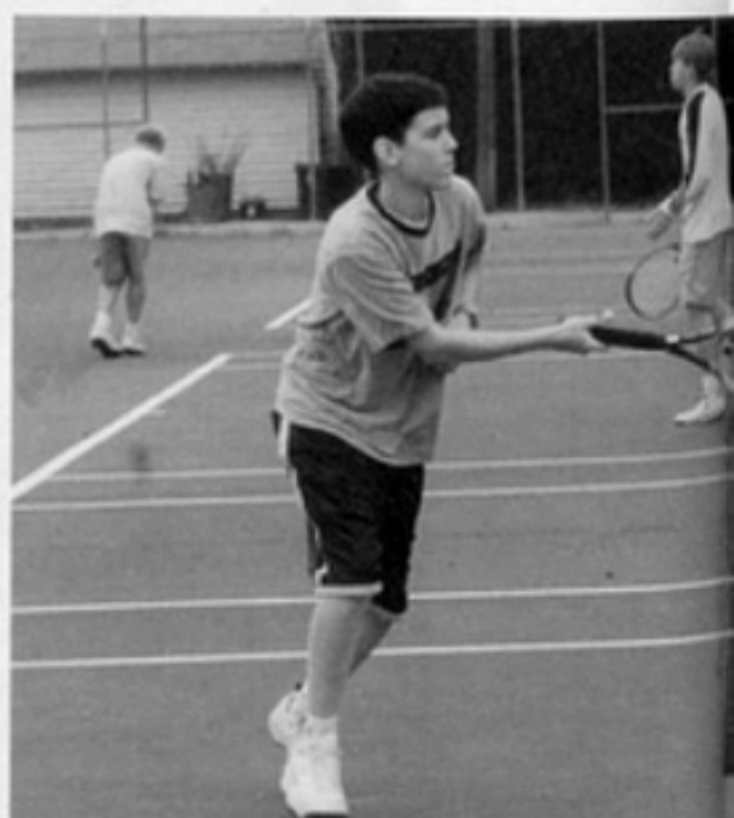

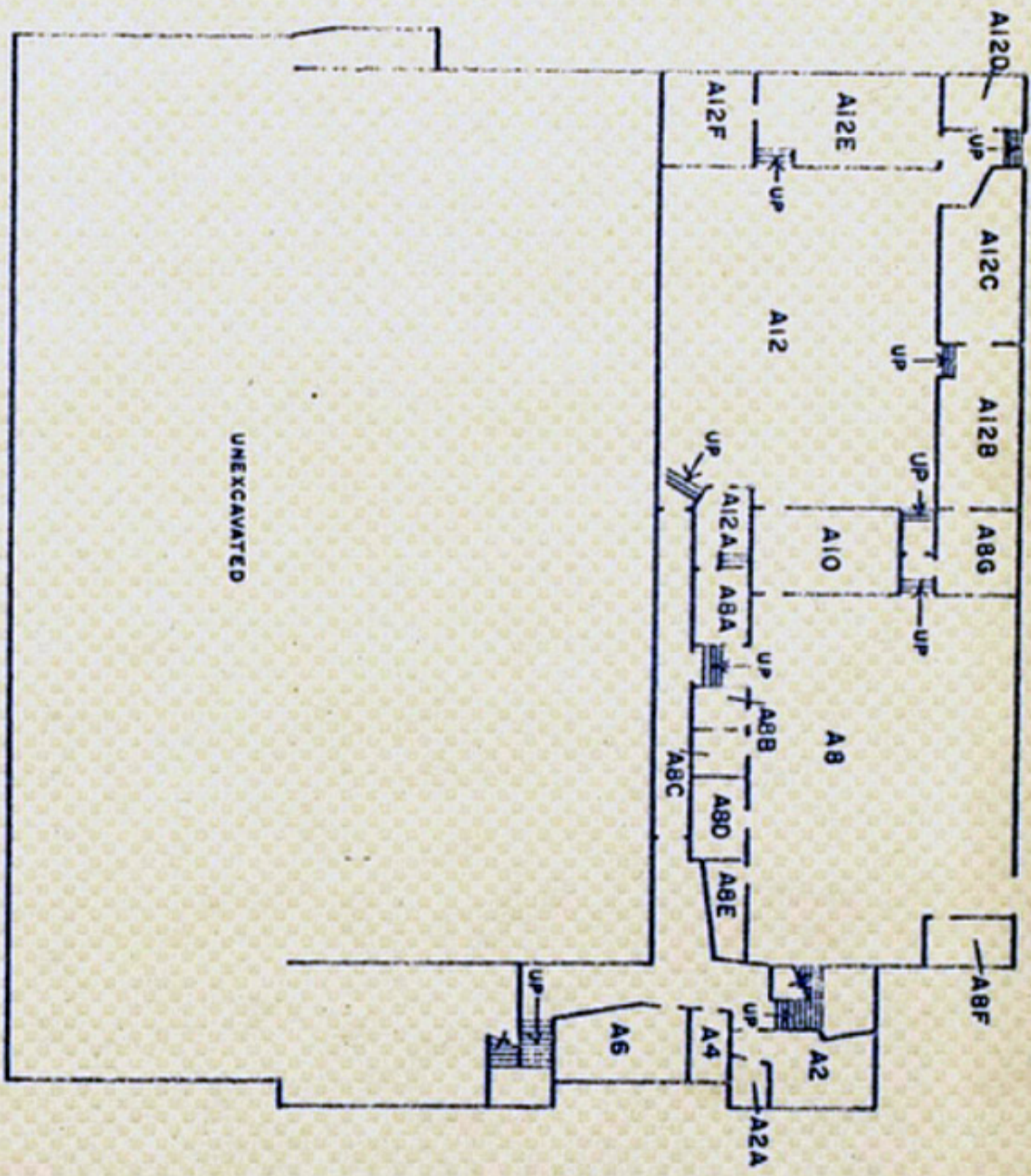


BASEMENT LEVEL
