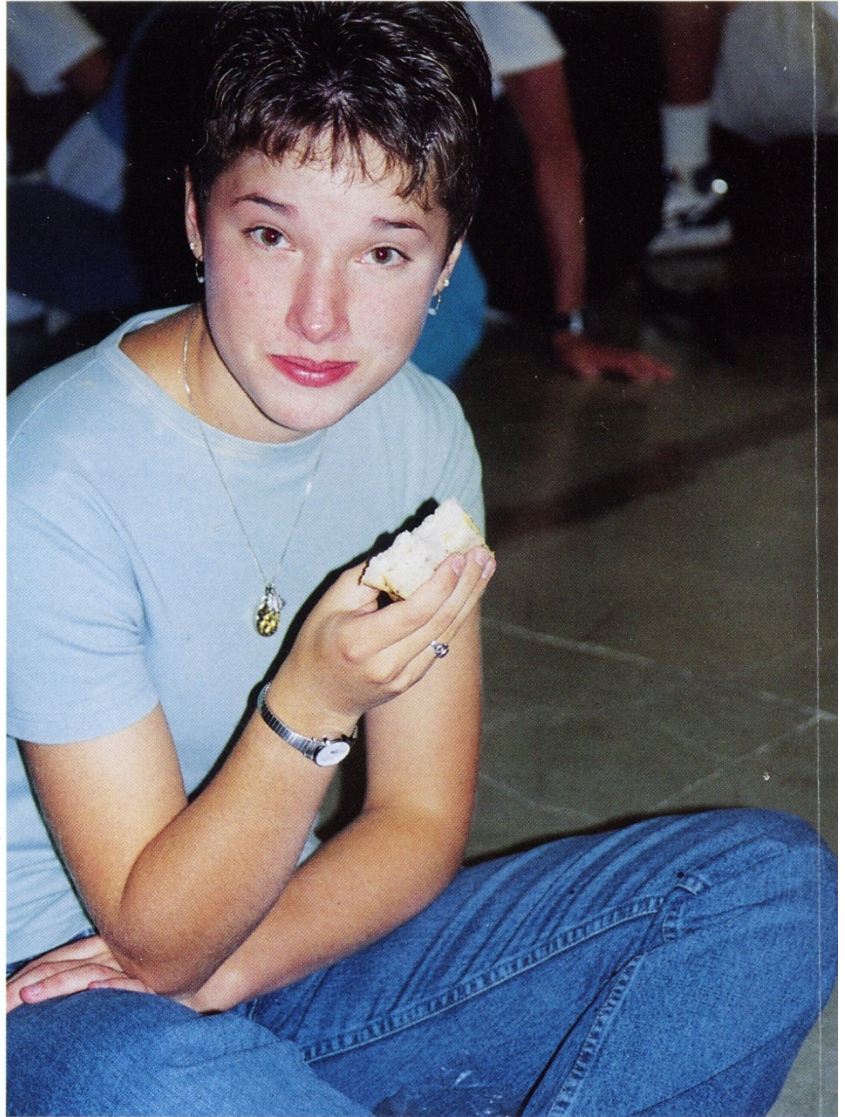
A Day In The Life...

The average high school student rolls out of bed between 6:00 and 7:00 a.m. to be in class when the bell rings at 8. At school they will spend the next five to six hours hanging out, goofing off, and/or learning.

This year, life in Holley Mason has been described as "exactly the same" and "very different" from life at LC. Some students have found Holley Mason difficult and annoying while others hardly acknowledge the move. Teachers have had to mold their classrooms and their lessons around the large cement columns, affecting the classroom atmosphere and even the student morale. Brian Houghton said, "Holley Mason is a lot more confined. LC's atmosphere was more open." This year students have also been forced to deal with the absence of lockers, crowded stairwells and few benches. "I never used my locker anyway," said senior Alicia Smith. On the other hand, many students complained about a place to put their coats and unneeded books. As a result, some teachers have added classroom sets of schoolbooks allowing students to leave their copies at home. The new building also limits approximately 1500 students to two main stairwells making life during passing periods quite difficult. Dylan Lipsker said, "I just use the elevators."

Since Holley Mason does not have a gymnasium, students taking PE, conditioning, photography, or English from Mr. Reyburn get to walk three blocks between classes. Most students who park in the student lot do not appreciate the extra walking either. Because the campus is so spread out, the administration decided to eliminate homeroom, reducing the number of times students would have to cross the streets. As a result, the bulletin is read during 2nd period and students vote for A.S.B. during lunch. Juniors and seniors who have kept the same homeroom for a few years are especially disappointed to lose that extra fifteen minutes.

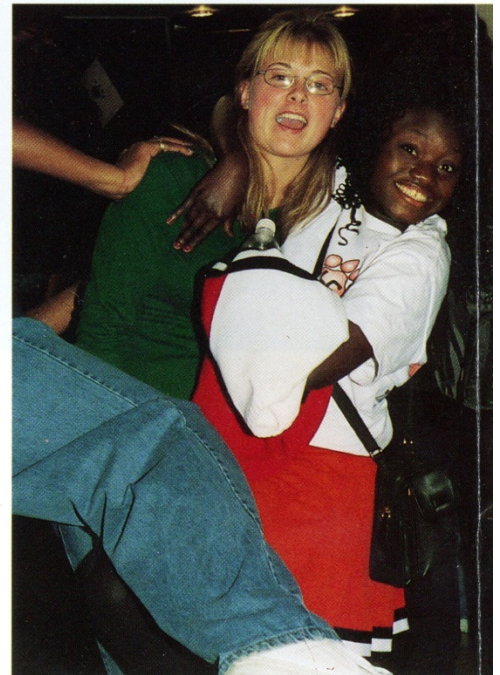

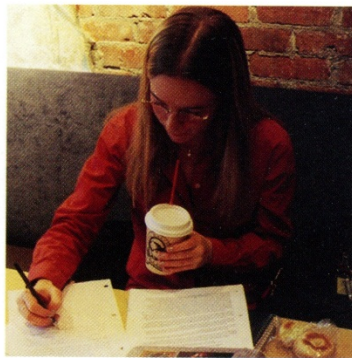

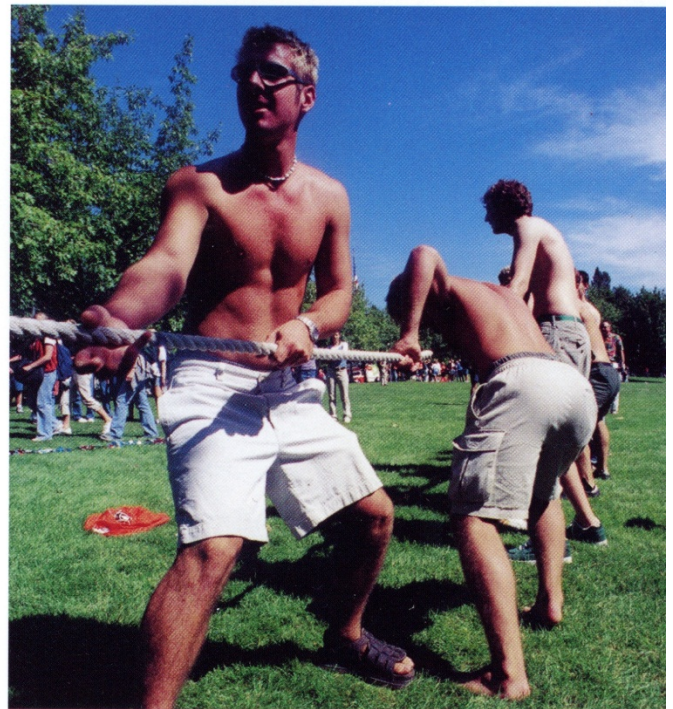

Hello Day

Once again, LC began the school year with festivities and fun. This year, however, the administration crammed it all into one afternoon. The action-packed September 10th afternoon began as LC students followed the band in a parade from the Holley Mason building, through downtown to the clock-tower meadow in Riverfront Park.

The day in the park began with the fall sports con at noon. Throughout the rest of the school day, students participated in several activities, including an ultimate Frisbee tournament, a tug-o-war featuring the math team versus the freshman football team, an egg toss, free IMAX, and a "bouncy boxing ring."

During the march down to the park, students followed obediently, waving to any camera that approached them. The LC math team also marched while singing a song and holding a banner that included the words, "2-4-6-8, We want to integrate." The call aimed to challenge the football team to a tug-o-war. The banner had a double meaning, showing that we want to "integrate" with downtown merchants and residents. Sophomore Taylor Marr noted, "I liked all the school spirit, and I liked sharing with downtown."

Several helping hands assisted in accomplishing the first ever march. LC's marching band, Downtown Security Ambassadors, Spokane Police, Riverfront Park, and the criminal justice class all contributed. "It will be their basic training with traffic control," grinned criminal justice teacher Lynn Bain. Also assisting in the process were a number of LC parents.

No major problems occurred during the event, and attendance was high. "The students are to be commended," said LC's assistant principal Dan Close. "They did what they were supposed to, picked up after themselves, and we got a lot of good compliments."

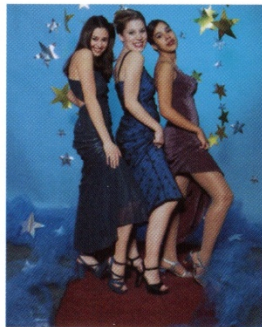

At the game that night, presentation of the royalty was different from past years, with a limousine and a convertible for the royalty, but a lack of organization made the ceremony almost anti-climactic. 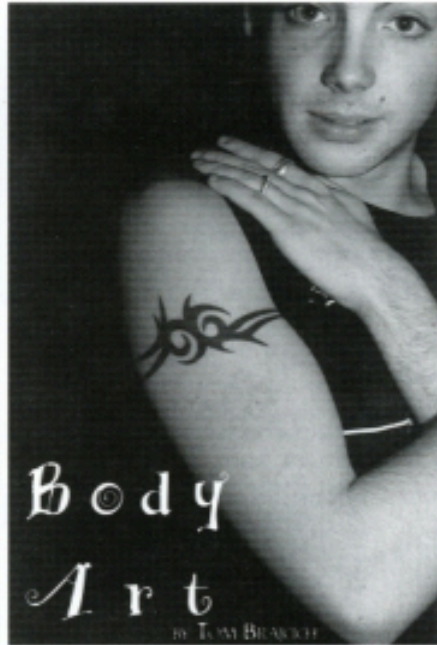

Drive-By-Egging: While driving by a friend's car, pelt a carton of eggs onto the windshield and side windows

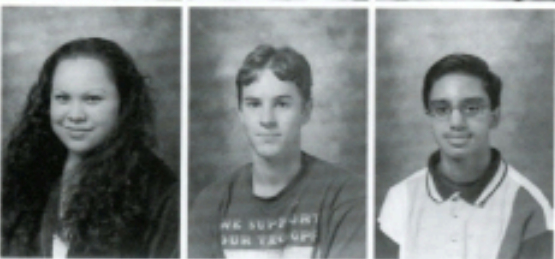

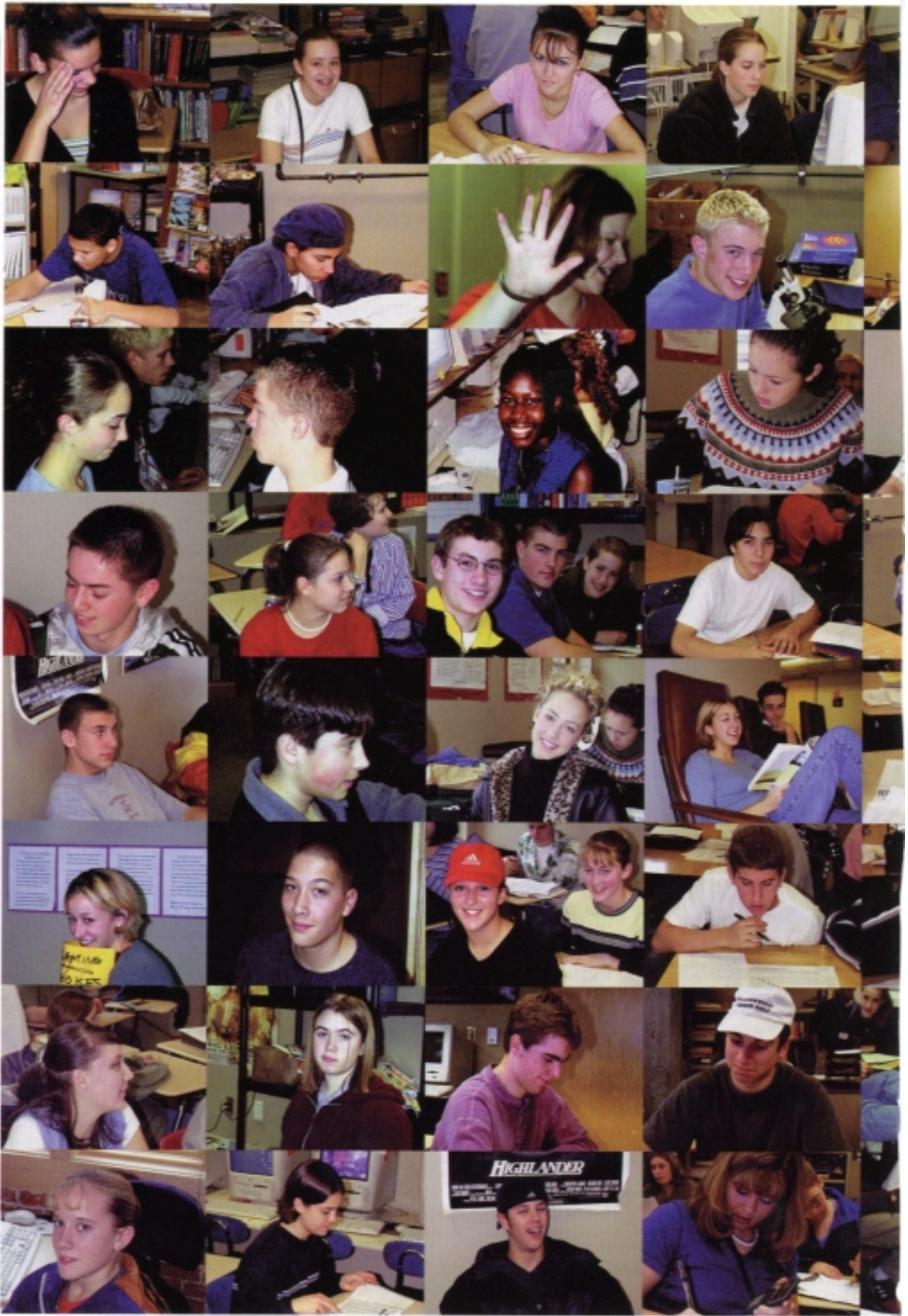

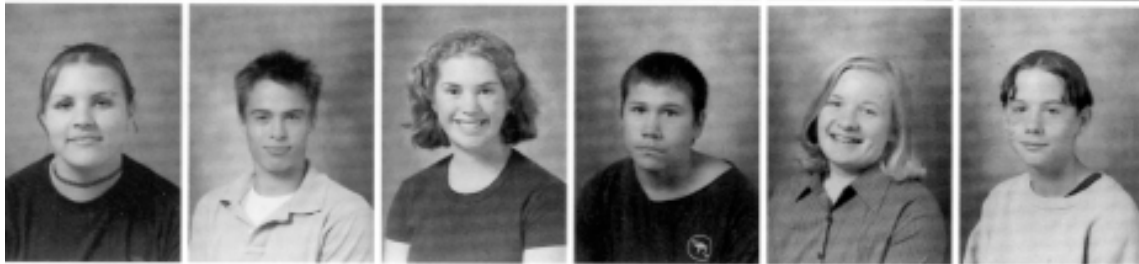

"The one good thing about the drills is you get an extra 10 minutes to visit with your friends," said Jennifer Slauris.

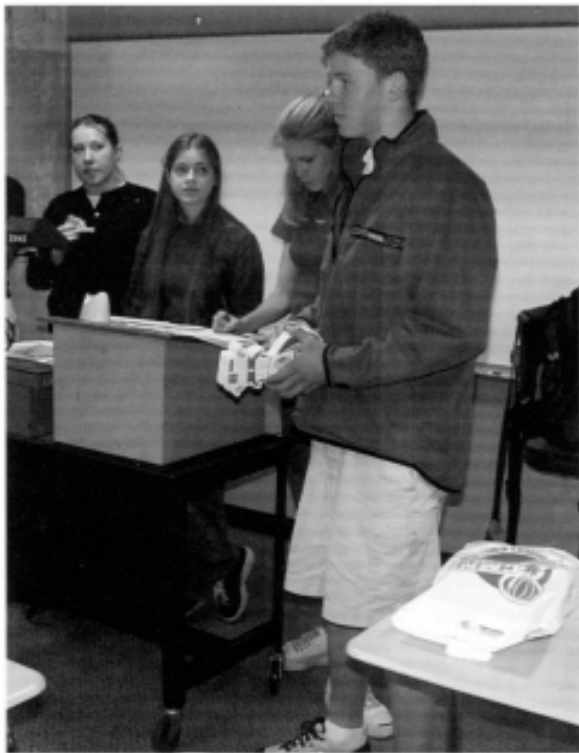

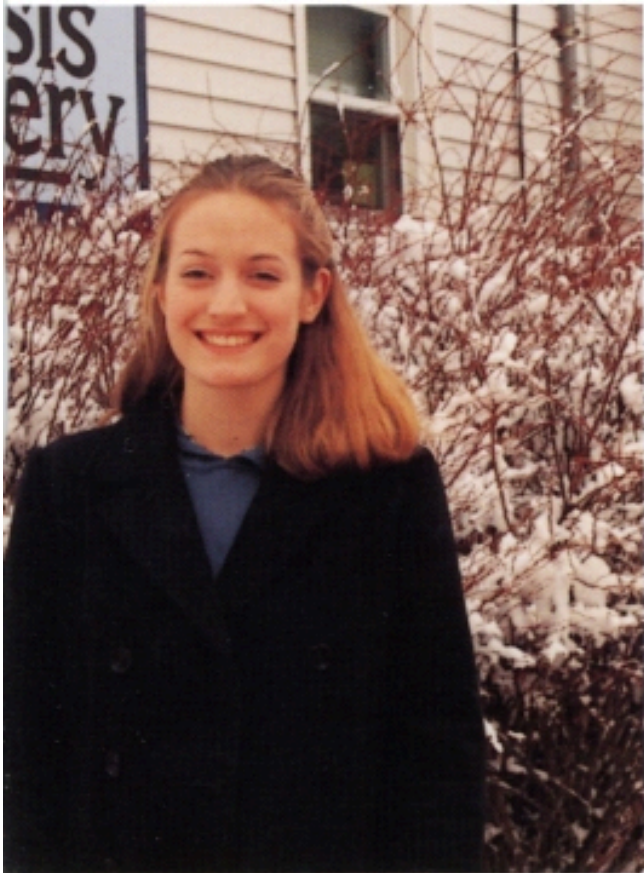
This year, practicum students have the opportunity to earn 5-quarter hours of college credit at Eastern Washington University.

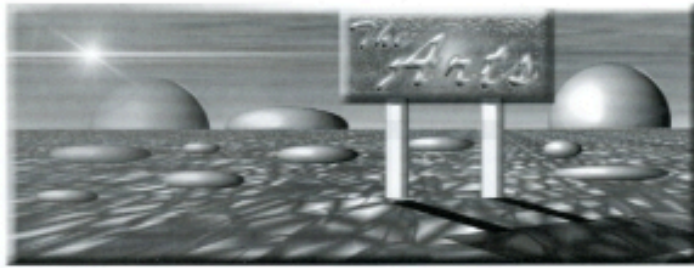

Varsity Football

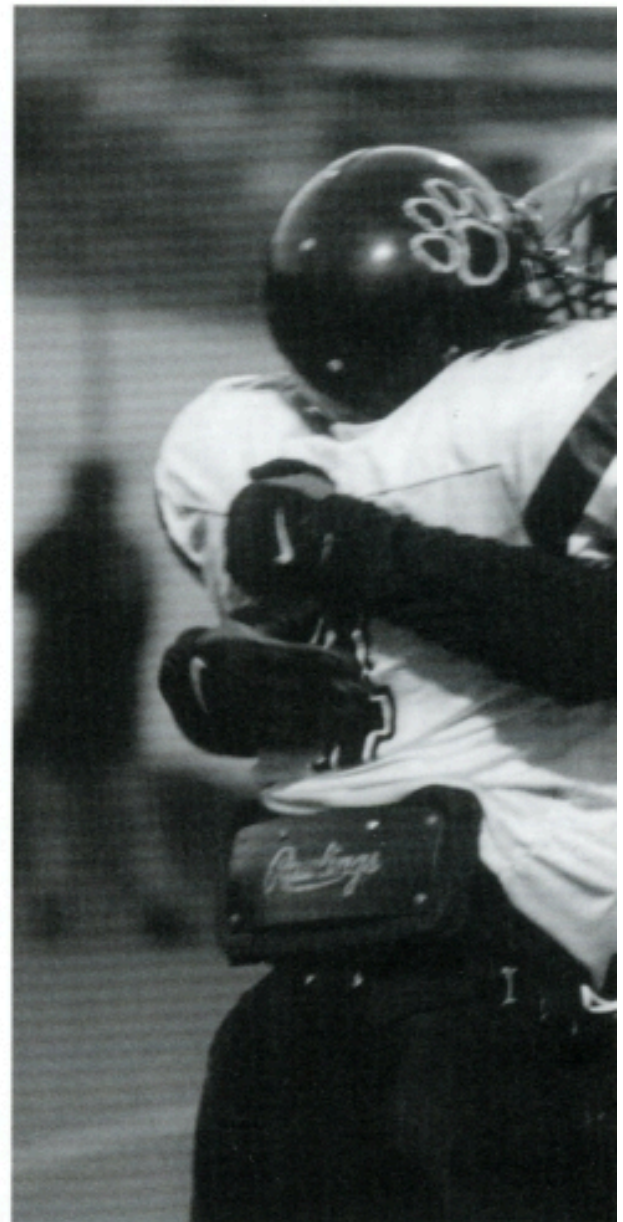

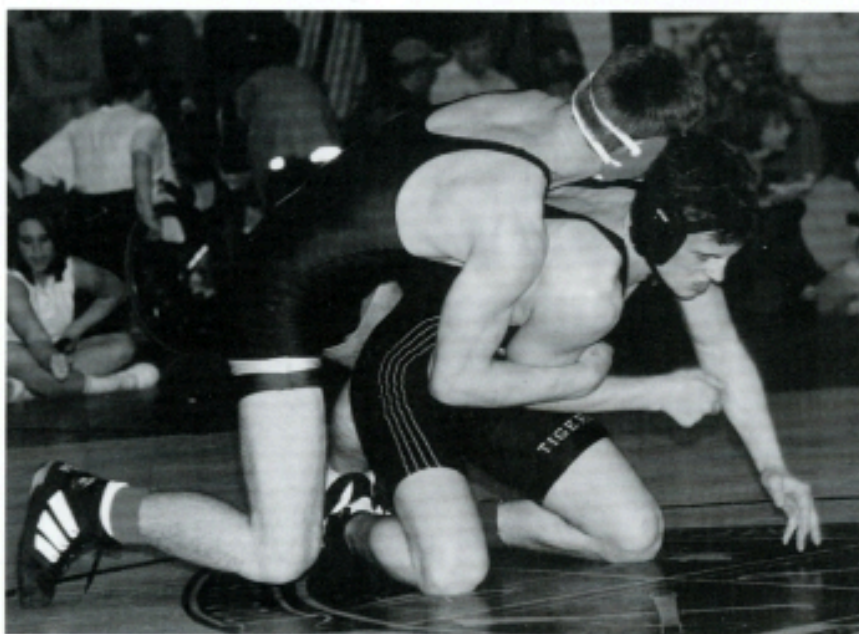

Varsity Wrestling

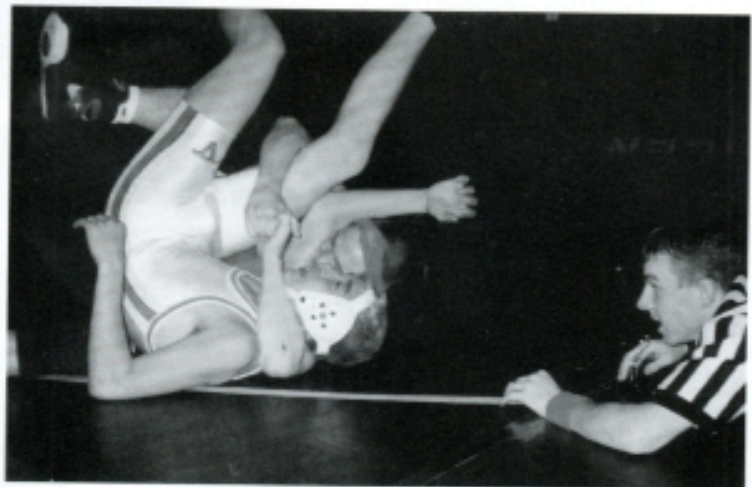

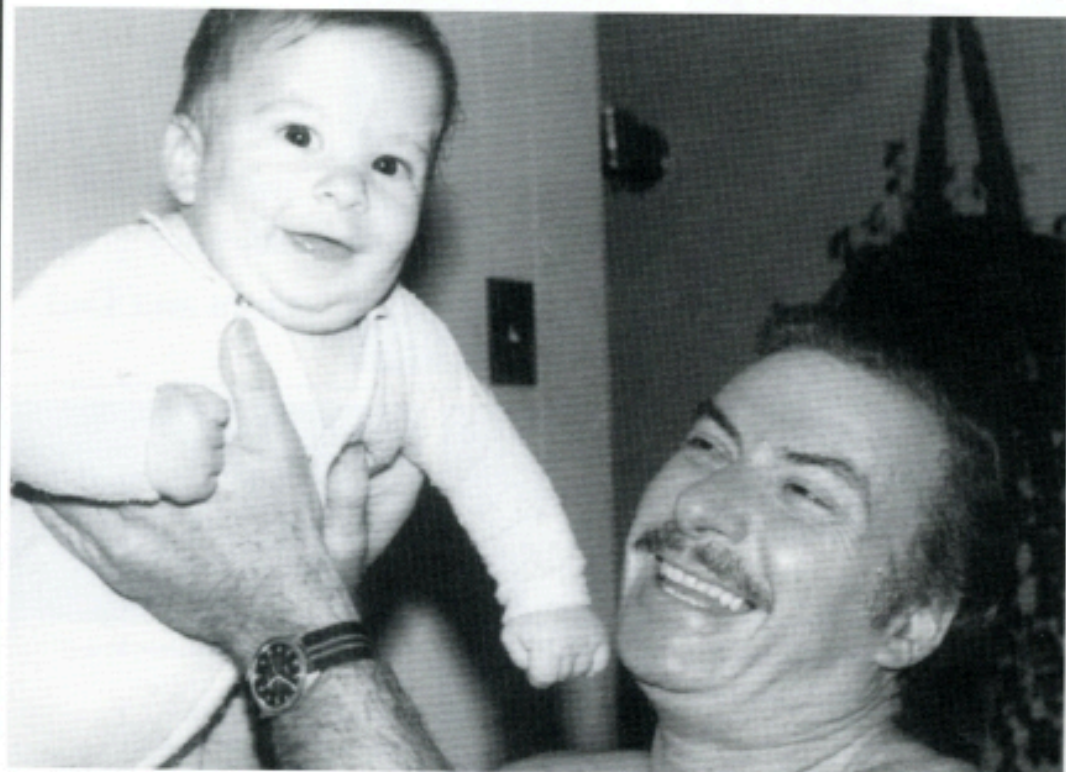

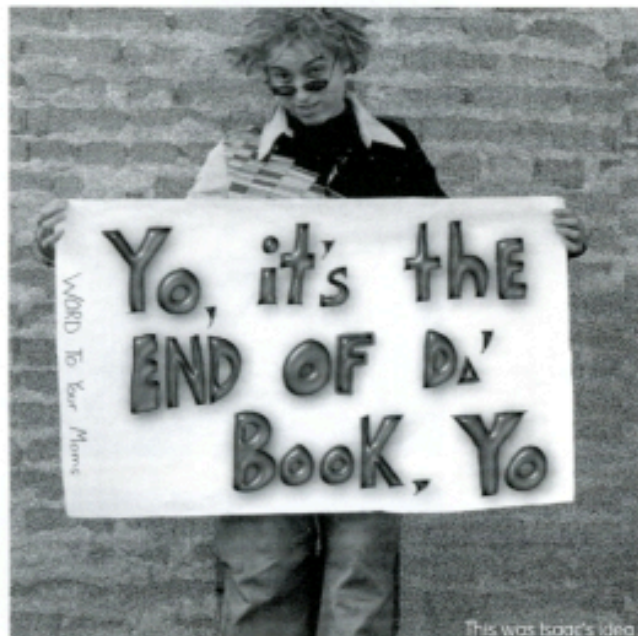
